1. Get the correct number from your new Grass Valley directory. Remember, all Grass Valley numbers change.
2. Jot the number down and keep it in front of you while you dial.
3. Be sure to dial the first two letters and numeral in the prefix. For example, to dial from Moro to EDison 3-2302 in Grass Valley, dial the prefix E-D-3 . . . then 2-3-0-2.

Calls to Moro (Jordan 5 numbers) and between Moro and Wasco (Gilbert 2 numbers) should be dialed the same way.
