### Moro and Grass Valley — Moro and Wasco



New phone numbers with the prefix EDison 3 have gone into service in Grass Valley.

And now, calls between Moro and Grass Valley and calls between Moro and Wasco can be dialed direct, toll-free.

#### FOR GOOD SERVICE.

1. Get the correct number from your new Grass Valley directory. Remember, all Grass Valley numbers have changed.
2. Jot the number down and keep it in front of you while you dial.
3. Be sure to dial the first two letters and numeral in the prefix. For example, to dial from Moro to EDison 3-2302 in Grass Valley, dial the prefix E-D-3 . . . then 2-3-0-2.

Calls to Moro (JORDAN 5 numbers) and between Moro and Wasco (GILBERT 2 numbers) should be dialed the same way.
