ANSWER: This is the "Portland Penny." The "Portland Penny" was the coin tossed by Pettygrove and Lovejoy to decide upon a new name for "Stumptown." Pettygrove wanted it named after Portland, Maine, and Lovejoy wanted it named after Boston, Massachusetts. Pettygrove won the toss, thus the name "Portland Penny."
