Mrs. Willard Barnett and Mrs. O. N. Ruggles went to The Dalles Monday and brought Mrs. William Cauthers home from the hospital.

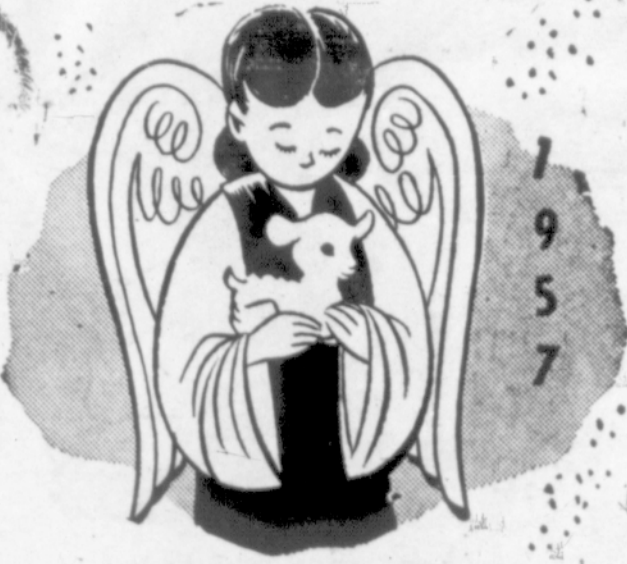
Mr. and Mrs. A. von Borstel were business visitors in The Dalles Wednesday.

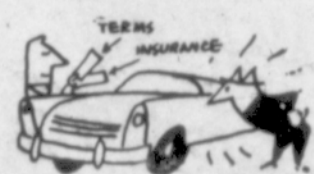
