Our club met March 4 and made muffins. Margaret Spencer and Dorothy Grater gave the demonstration. Then we all enjoyed eating the muffins.

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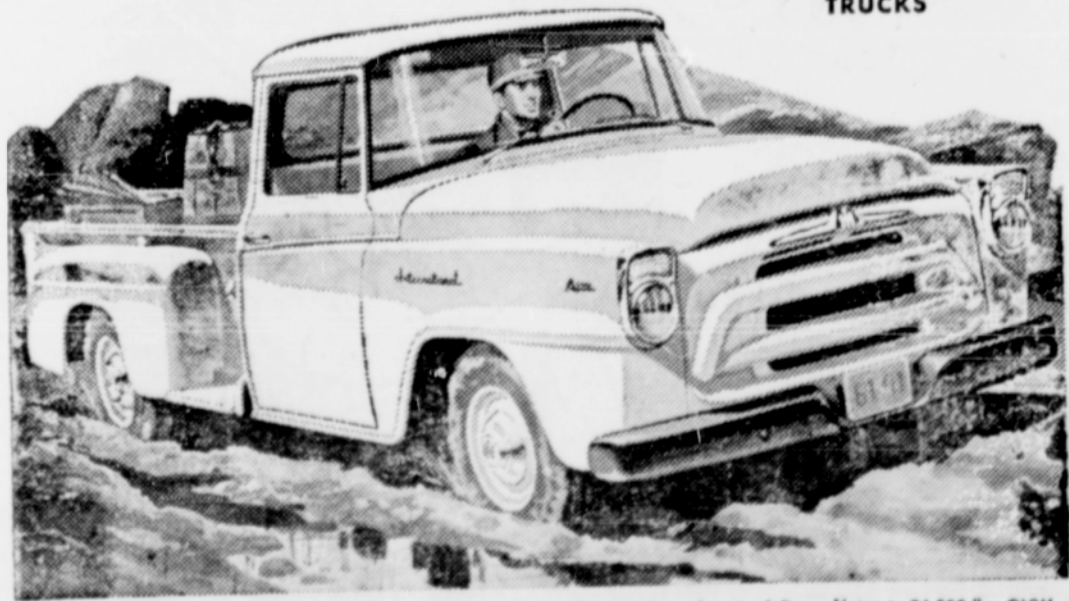
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
