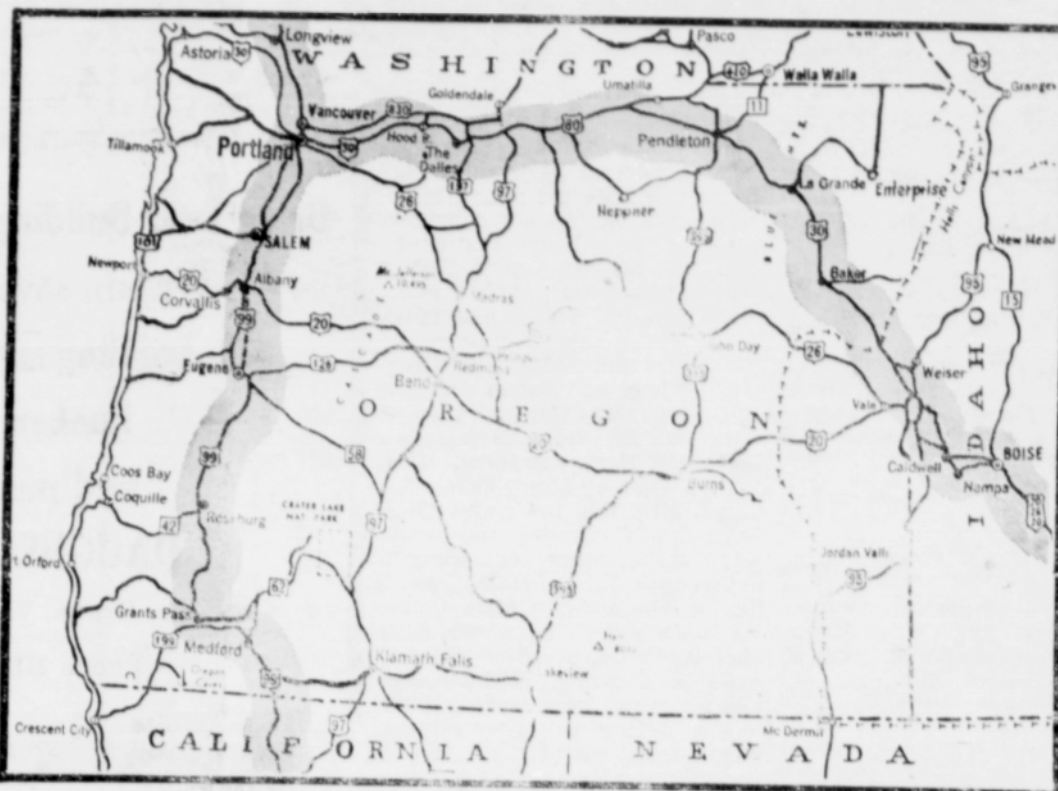

Stilbestrol Tried On Local Cattle

Stilbestrol trials on the A. B. Christianson ranch last year showed a .31 pound per day increase in gain using 36mg of stilbestrol. Treated steers gained 2.11 pounds per day and untreated steers 1.80 pounds per day. Stilbestrol implants were used with injection made January 14, 1957. Animals were weighed at treating time and when sold on July 13. The increase gain on five steers amounted to 278 pounds or \$45, for five steers selling at 20 cent per pound. Returns are then \$9.00 per head more for treated animals at a cost of 10 cents for material for implanting.

OREGON'S FEDERAL AID HIGHWAY SYSTEM



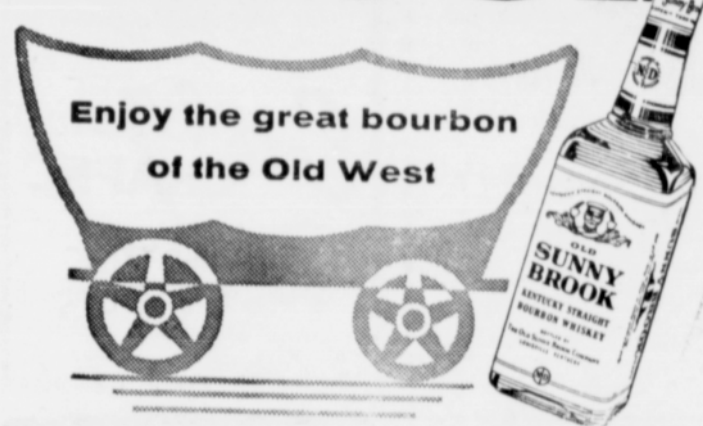
By 1971, or soon after, this network of modern highways will link Oregon with the rest of the nation's interstate system. Made possible by the signing of the Federal Highway Act of 1956, Oregon has moved speedily into a new era of highway planning and construction. More highway construction was contracted during 1957 than in any other year in the history of the State Highway Department. During the 13-year scope over which the Federal Highway Act currently extends, Oregon will spend about \$1,040,000,000 or an average of \$80 million per year. This is nearly 25 percent more than the some \$817 million spent during the entire 40-year existence of the state highway system. (A public service by the Cement Industry of Oregon)
