The editor was commenting on the library facilities in the state. He wrote, "Eighteen counties provide less than \$1.00 per capita per year for library service. One county with among the highest per capita assessed valuations in the state gives no public support to library service."

The Moro Public Library has not requested county help. The City of Moro has given financial assistance the past few years. We are proud of the library service we can offer without asking for county help this far. It is only possible to give this service by the efforts of the volunteer librarians, the contribution of space at a very moderate expense and the generous donations of books and gifts by friends of the library.

The Oregonian editor concludes, and we agree, "This is no direct plug for more taxes for Oregon libraries. Rather it is an invitation to Oregonians, particularly those who haven't visited the library recently, to do so. They will in some cases be surprised and pleased at the multiplicity and richness of service offered by the modern library. In all too

many cases they will be surprised even indignant at the lack of service in their community. Both of these conflicting emotions should encourage interest in the library."


