**RETURN TO SANITY**

An observer will notice that in the discussions about the present economic recession that the reasons ascribed to its origin and the cures suggested for its end are based on a much better brand of economic thinking than has been the case in similar recessions and/or depressions in recent years.

Almost no one in the public prints that get wide readership has invoked the name of John Maynard Keynes. We think that means that we are forgetting Karl Marx whose prophecies were responsible for a good bit of the new deal hysterics of the thirties. The men who learned their economics in the depths of the depression, who were taught that this nation was at the end of its rope, that governmental give-aways were the salvation of the ill-fed, ill-housed, etc., have either learned they were wrong or have been silenced by the wave of sounder thinking.

The aged and respected Bernard Baruch said some very sensible things to a congressional committee and was not shouted down as being an old-fashioned economist. Instead the law-makers listened and we think a large part of the citizenry applauded.

We are not going to spend ourselves rich. The way to cure a recession is not to spend more, but less. Learning the economic facts of life has been long delayed because of the popularity of federal hand-me-outs and a big war and a little one. But the truth will out. We hope the nation has not been so badly damaged from the foolish ideas that prevailed for nearly thirty years that it cannot recover.

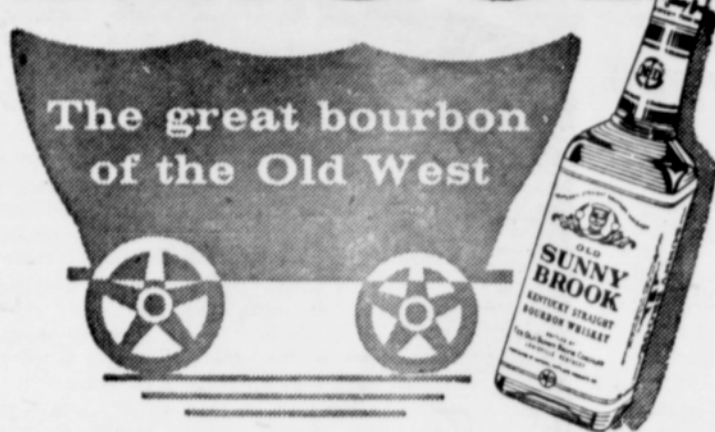

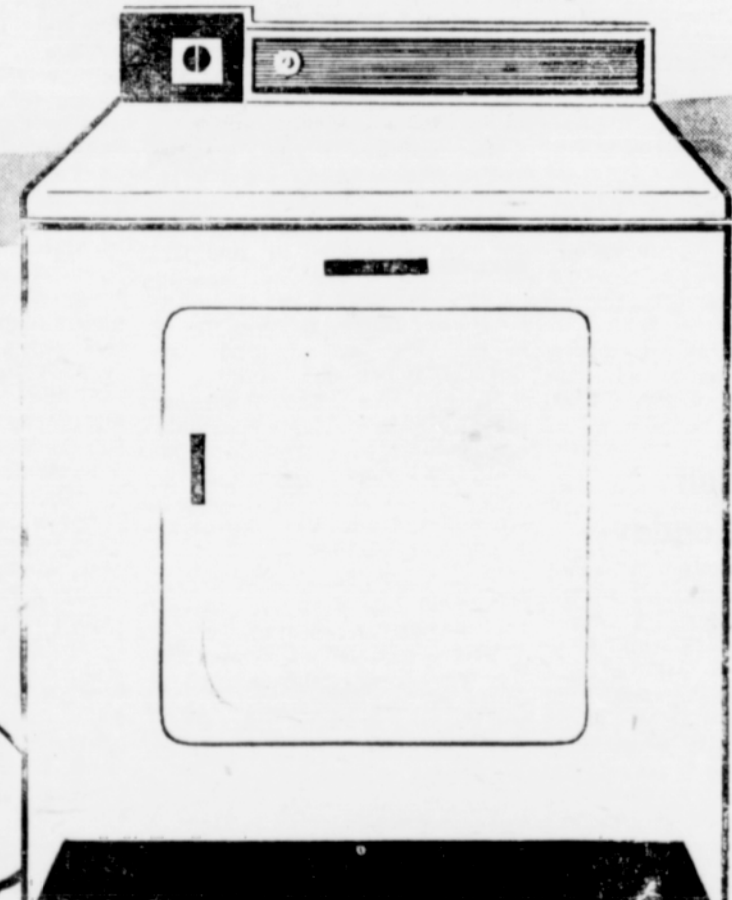
