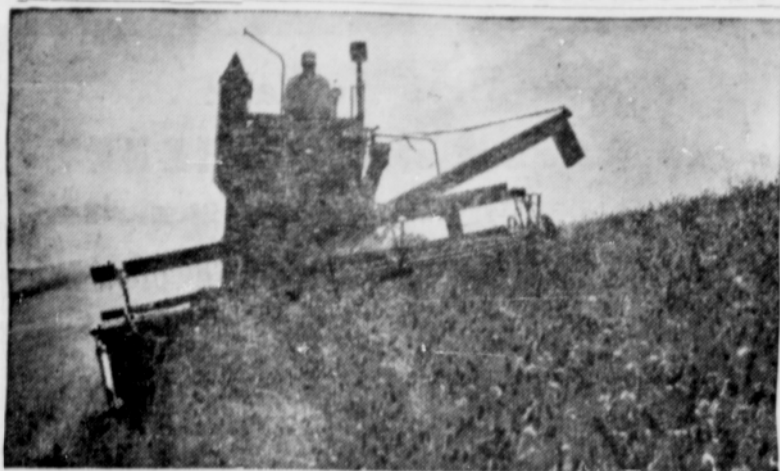

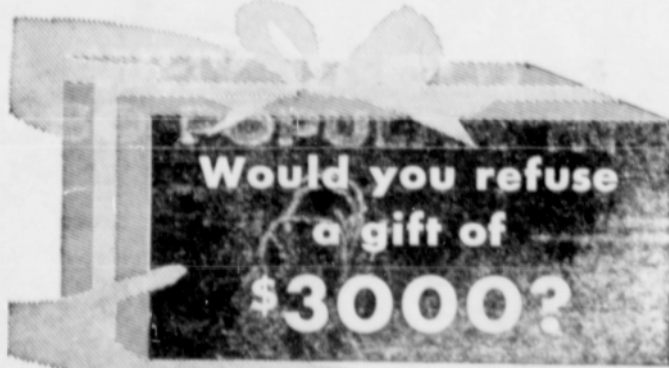

limitation imposed by Section 11, Article XI, of the

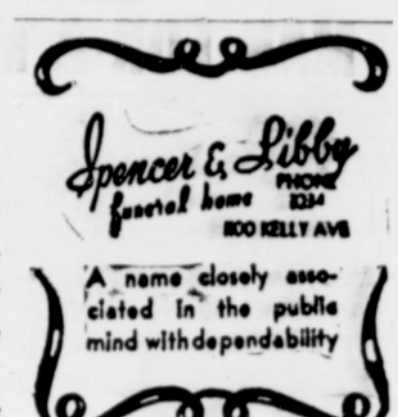
