THE ELECTION

Voters made their irrevocable decisions Friday and that is it. Dissenters may do as they please about it.

Generally, we think, the election was a pretty good one especially in Portland where voters showed more discretion than has been apparent for some time. In the fall there will, in many cases, be a choice between men whose records indicate capability.

The gubernatorial candidates have been hailed as from the "liberal" wing of both parties. That may mean something — or nothing. A liberal is one who advocates and aids in the realization of liberty for the individual. We are not certain that the appellation fits either Mr. Hatfield or Mr. Holmes but we are for it.

The Republicans cast about 230,000 votes for governor and the Democrats about 210,000 although having a 40,000 larger registration. That may be because the former are usually more regular voters. It does indicate that the election this fall may be close and the race made by Mr. Hatfield over strong opponents shows that he must be considered the leading candidate.

If our knowledge about the various candidates for the legislature is reasonably correct a less radical group will be assembled in Salem next session than was true in 1957—and that is good. The growth of the Democratic party has brought some spirit to the sensible members of that political division and it may present a more responsible group of candidates than it has since being led down the primrose path by the new dealers almost thirty years ago.

BUCK HOLLOW

We note with dislike that the state highway department still persists in calling Buck Hollow Buck Creek. Some years ago we wrote about this and were informed that it was called Buck Creek because there couldn't be a hollow unless there was a creek. That, we consider, a good example of the Willamette valley mind. Actually in eastern Oregon

there are many hollows that contain creeks but a short time in the spring. The original settlers named them hollows because that is what they were. If they were rough enough they were called canyons and perhaps Buck Hollow should be called a canyon. But in most of the years since settlement the creek in it is a feeble thing nine months of the year.

We do not suppose that it would be possible to change the sign department of the state highway by educating it to the facts of eastern Oregon geology. Yet, it would add something to the variety of names if it could be reformed. There are dozens of Buck creeks but so far as we know, only one Buck Hollow. The inflexibility of the unimaginative should not be permitted to rob us of a place name so distinctive as Buck Hollow.

A parcel of land lying in Lot 6, Block 16, Sherman Addition, City of Grass Valley, situated in Section 35, Township 2 South, Range 16 East, Willamette Meridian, Sherman County, Oregon; the said parcel being that portion of said Lot 6 included in a strip of land 45 feet in width, lying on the easterly side of the centerline of the Sherman Highway as said highway has been relocated, which center line is described as follows:

Beginning at Engineer's centerline Station 978+10.23, said Station being 1925 feet North and 846.0 feet East of the West quarter corner of said Section 35; thence South 00° 03' 00" East 2550.56 feet to Engineer's center line Station 1003+60.79, the easterly line of said strip of land crossing the northerly and southerly lines of said Lot 6 approximately opposite Engineer's Stations 994+98 and 995+65, respectively.
