Kids of all ages, mostly small ones, gather daily at pre-arranged meeting places to take busses to The Dalles where they receive swimming instruction and splash in the water, an abiding joy for all children.

The program is very popular. Not many children actually learn to swim or that having a rudimentary knowledge of that art has saved as many lives as have been lost through over confidence; but because it gives the kids something to do, keeps them under surveillance and gets them out of parents' hair for a dozen forenoons of a long summer.

Kids have their lives well planned for them in these times. No more is the end of school a time for discarding shoes (if not done before), donning an old straw hat and going forth alone or with like-minded companions into a summer of adventure. Whatever supervision there was a generation or two ago consisted of insistence on spitting some wood or milking the cow and coming to meals. None was easy for parents or children.

Few families now raise much of their living so there are few cows to be milked, few potatoes to hoe. Forty years ago a boy would have delighted in that situation. He would have ridden to a swimming hole of his own choosing, shot sage rats, climbed trees to carve his initials on the smallest limb, pegged tops and stubbed his begrimed toes on rocks far from home. No one could boss him; he was on his own.

The psychologists would say that such a way of spending the summers produced an entirely different adult than the group-governed lads of today.
