Yellow Dwarf Virus On Grains

A new virus disease of cereals has been identified on various barley fields in Sherman county this spring. The disease known as yellow dwarf virus first was noted in California in 1951. Since that time it has moved into the Willamette valley and now exists in the Columbia Basin counties.

The virus was located in barley fields this past spring by the assistance of W. B. Raymer, extension plant pathologist, OSC. Samples were taken from the Wasco area and east of Moro. The virus was noted previously at the Sherman branch station on both barley and oats.

The virus is identified by a brilliant leaf yellowing of barley accompanied by moderate to severe stunting. The disease on wheat causes stunting and chlorosis and a reddening of oats - red leaf. The problem occurs mainly with late-planted spring grain.

The disease is caused by a virus. The virus is readily transmitted by at least five different species of grain-infecting aphids. Spread of the disease does not occur by mechanical means, by seed nor in the soil. The virus has a wide range of host in the grass family. Initial spring infestation probably occurs from infested grasses along fence rows or pastures by the various aphids.

The disease probably will not be of significant importance in Sherman county since we are mostly a winter wheat county. Heavy spring grain plantings and
