SCHOOL BUDGETS
Anyone who has been reading the school budgets as published for the benefit of taxpayers prior to the levying of the district tax will be a little surprised, we are sure, at the differences between them. Management of school affairs varies and some districts get into habits of spending while others are careful.

First it will be remembered that the last report gave Rufus a census of 85, Wasco of 171, Moro 191, Grass Valley 146 and Kent 80 and that accounts for some of the differences.

The cost of personal service under the school lunch program goes like this: Rufus \$3000, Wasco \$2800, Moro \$3195, Grass Valley \$2150, Kent \$1575. Cooks at Kent serve meals for less than \$20 a year per pupil while at Rufus they get \$40.

The salaries of principals varies widely depending on length of service and number of pupils probably. Rufus \$6250, Wasco \$1240 (partly included as teacher) Moro \$6960, Grass Valley \$5850, Kent \$6960.

For teachers the variations are larger. Rufus \$19,500 (with provision for another teacher at \$4,450.) Wasco \$18,250 (including part of principal), Moro \$37,025, Grass Valley \$17,075, Kent, \$10,800.

By adding principal's salary to that of teachers because most principals do teach the cost per pupil for teaching, excluding kindergarten, and based on September enrollment is \$644 at Rufus, \$409 at Wasco, \$403 at Moro, \$252 at Grass Valley, \$507 at Kent.

Substitute teaching is listed at from \$350 to \$750 with \$500 being about an average.

Janitors get \$4,500 at Rufus, \$4200 at Wasco, \$4100 at Moro, \$3100 at Grass Valley and \$3000 at Kent. Fuel costs \$1300 at Rufus, \$3000 at Wasco, \$1500 at Moro, \$1250 at Grass Valley and \$1500 at Kent. Light and power estimates are \$900 at Rufus, \$1000 at Wasco, \$600 at Moro, \$1000 at Grass Valley and \$800 at Kent.

Bus systems vary, too, as judged by one phase of cost of transporting pupils to school. Cost of bus drivers' is \$7435 at Rufus, \$6225 at Wasco, \$11,710, at Moro, \$8550 at Grass Valley and \$7800 at Kent.

Without knowing how many books are at present in the libraries it would be impossible to rate the purchase of books but the budgets show \$310 for Rufus, \$300 for Wasco, \$100 for Moro, \$200 for Grass Valley, \$200 for Kent.

A management expert could find use for his talents herein.


