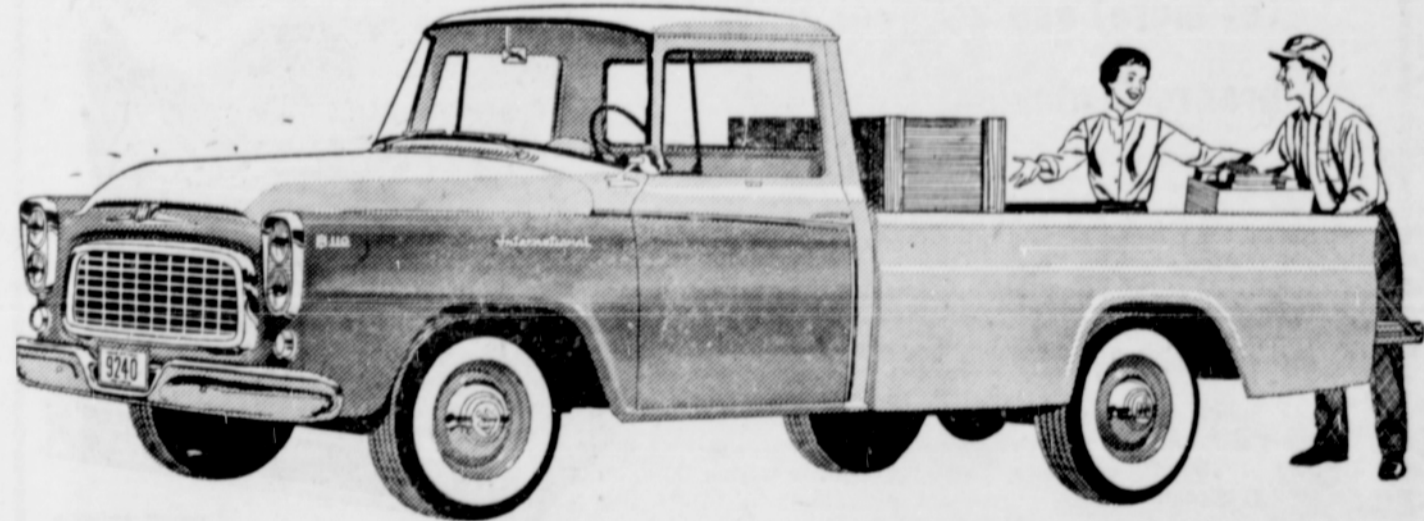
NOTICE OF SCHOOL MEETING
