**TAX PROGRAM**

This newspaper has been trying to be cheerful about the Oregon legislature because it has beaten some bad bills and has shown a sense of public responsibility not much in evidence in 1957.

Now that the tax program has been brought out in what some hoped would be the last week of the session we can no longer be cheerful. That program is a mess of minor, niggling changes that will raise little money and will annoy citizens as much as possible. Folks are not going to like to pay taxes on their federal income tax or their payments for interest or their payments of property taxes. Neither will they like the removal of the right to split their income between husband and wife and their deductions in most cases.

While the extra exemption for aged and the blind is not a very important matter to the state as a whole it means quite a bit to the oldsters.

The proposal to substitute a sort of business tax for inventory taxes does not seem to be well worked out and turning the money from it to schools is a bit of insanity. New taxes on tobacco and liquor increases the income from two sources already overburdened.

Neither do we favor the sales tax as a means of raising the money the legislature thinks it needs. We favor some of the same economy citizens have to exercise. It does not scare us in the least that many other editors think the cost of government must continue to go up at the present rapid rate. We do not believe it.

This legislature has increased the budget for higher education by some 17 per cent. Presumably that includes the \$6,444,656 for extension work which got \$4,572,768 in 1957-58 and \$5,649,043 in 1958-59. We do not mind so much the comparable increase in research although part of it is misused.

The inclusion of Mr. Hatfield's one percent tax on everyone will help a little although lowering the exemption figure would have been better.

But with the surplus spent and the voters in a saving mood we think the spending will have to stop pretty soon, but apparently not by legislative action.
