**Oregon In History**

June 9, 1902—Harry Tracey and David Merrill, convicts, escaped from the penitentiary at 7 o'clock this morning and made their way to freedom, having killed three guards and badly wounded a convict who tried to bar their way. The convicts, who are professional criminals, of the most dangerous type, somehow secured rifles and revolvers, probably through some inmate recently released. Of the two, Tracey is considered the more vicious. Company F of the Oregon National Guard has been called in to aid in the search and a reward of \$500 has been posted for the capture of Merrill and \$1000 for the capture of Tracey. A full-scale manhunt is underway.

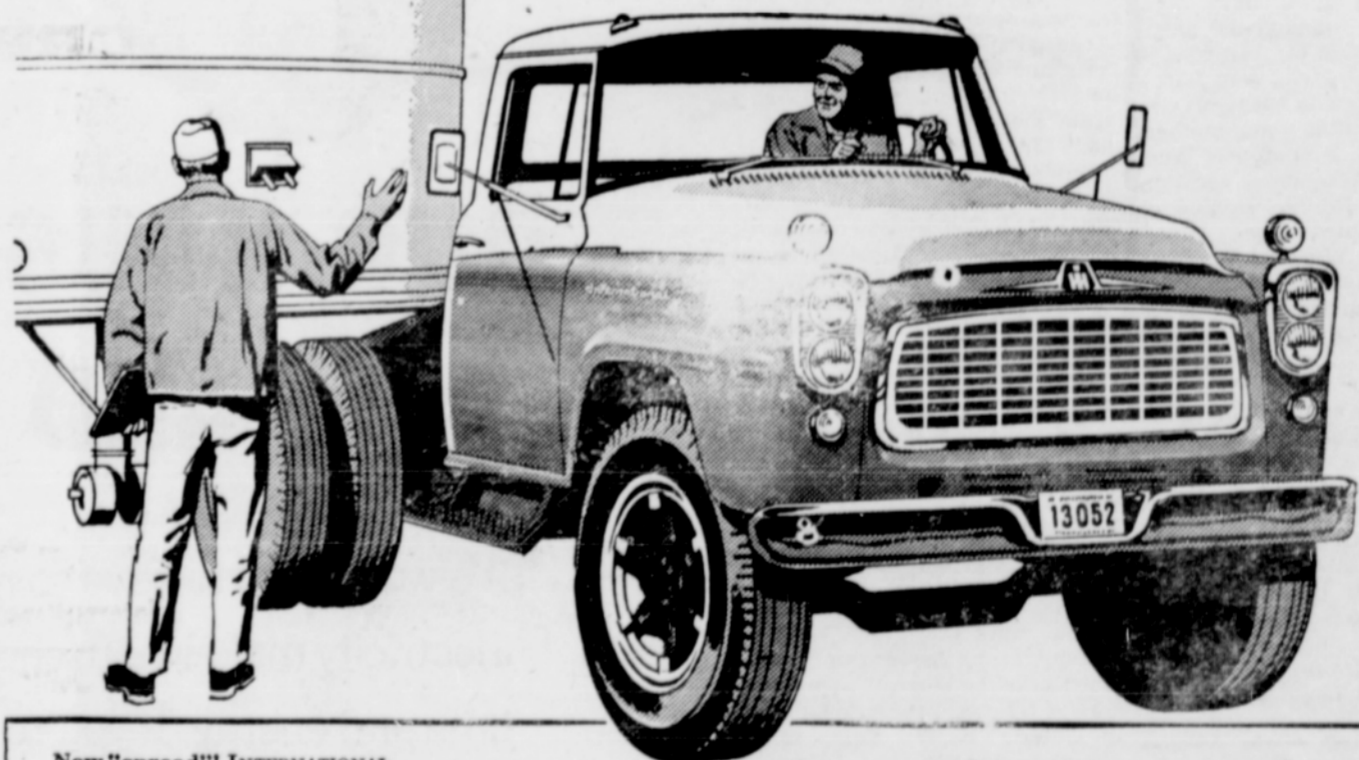
