CENSUS GETTING ALONG ON SCHEDULE

According to Guy E. Rainboth, regional field director in Seattle, touches of both tragedy and comedy have marked Uncle Sam's farm census in the Pacific Northwest.

An enumerator in Washington died from a heart attack after two days in the field.

An Idaho enumerator, driving on a county road, hit a cow. The cow was unhurt, the enumerator reported, but the automobile suffered \$100 worth of damages. In Oregon an enumerator scared up a deer on a mountain road. The deer caused a small landslide. The enumerator's car received a hole in the transmission.

Several enumerators have suffered dog bites, none serious. An reportedly slipped into a posthole and suffered a fractured shoulder.

The farm census began early in Montana, and the enumerators work was virtually completed before the recent blizzard. In the Pacific Northwest as a whole, the count is better than half over. Enumerators in Wasco, Sherman and Hood River counties expect to wind up the count within a week or ten days.

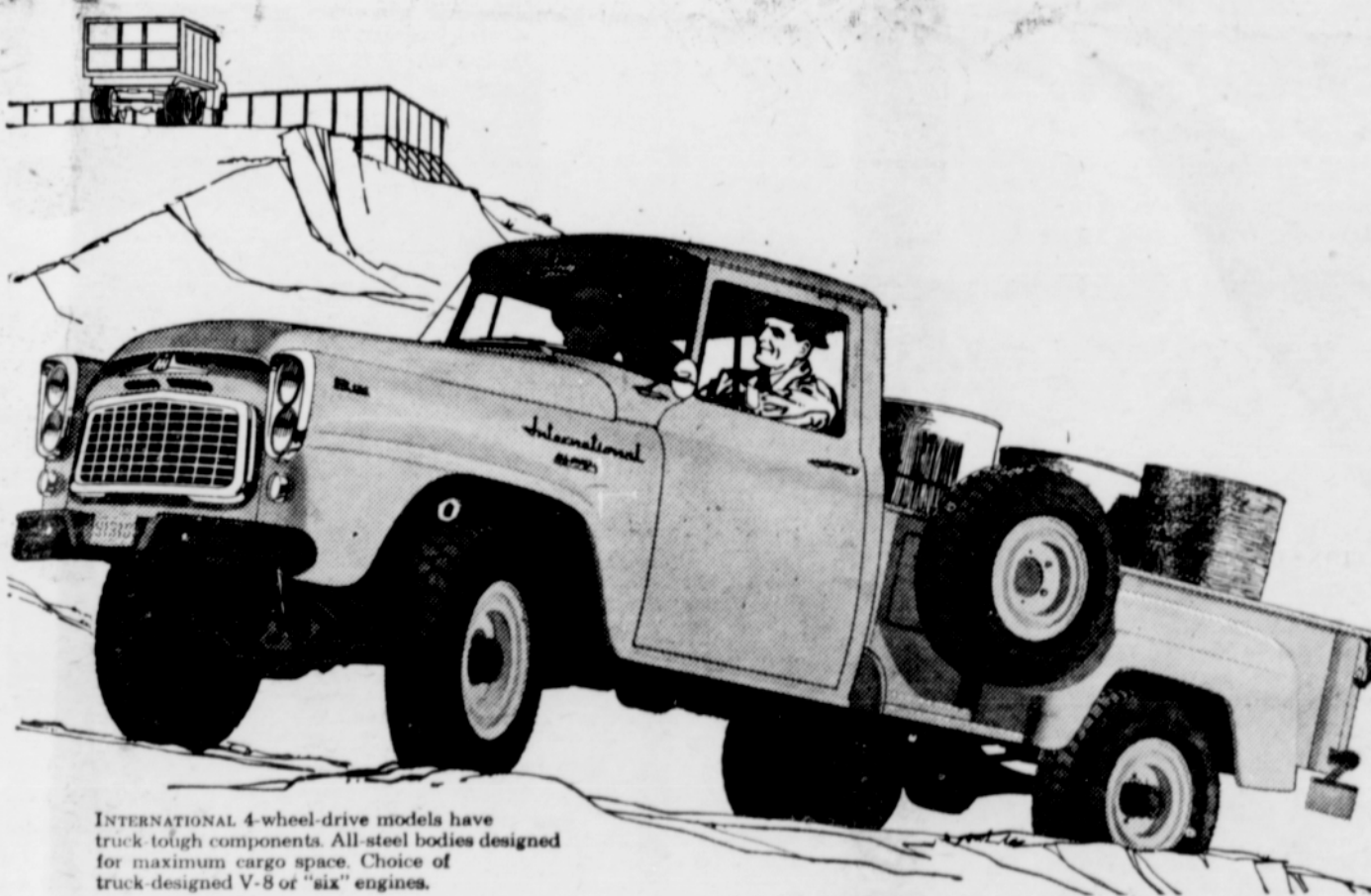
