Wasco Methodist church have been enriched by organ music. The Millers donated their own electric organ to the church.

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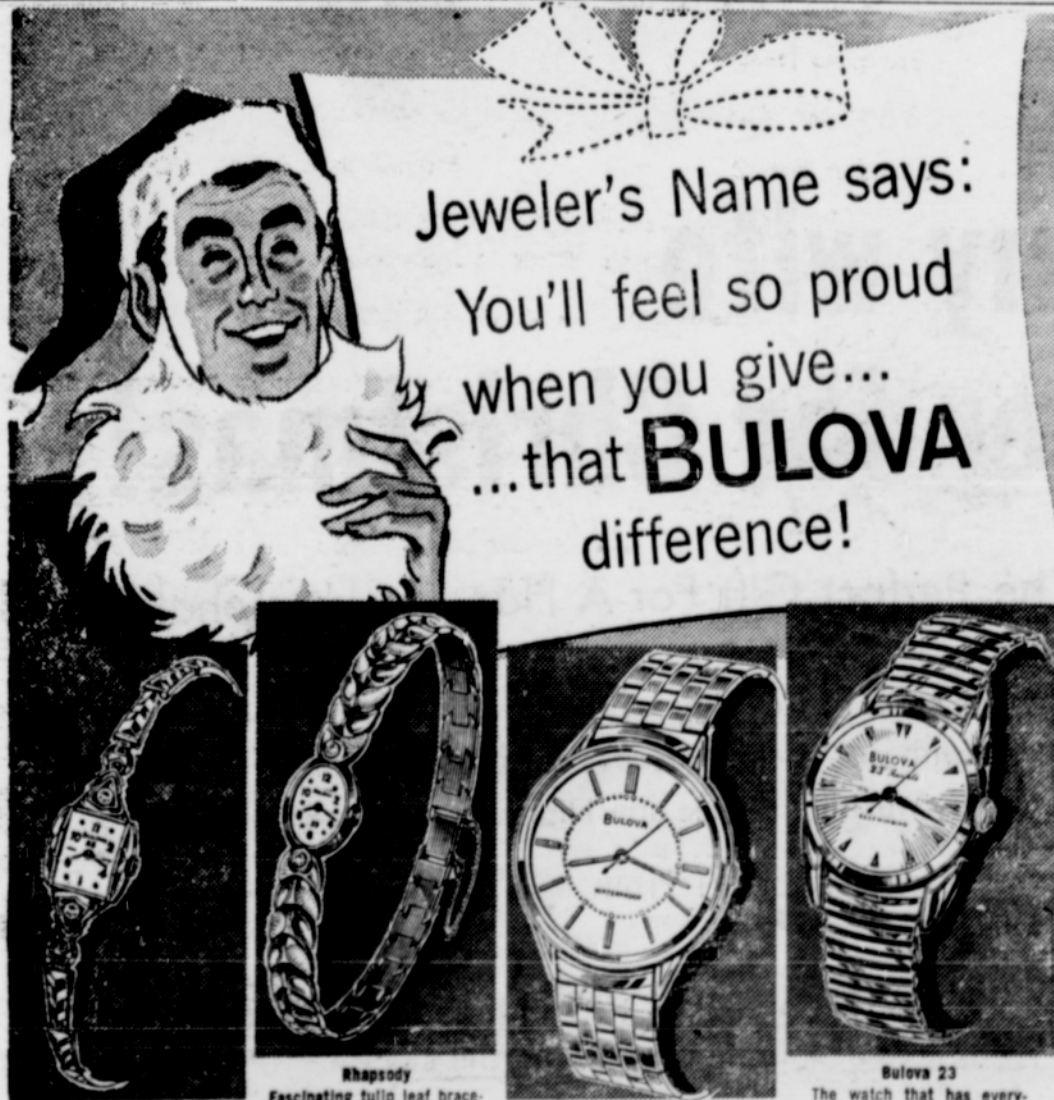
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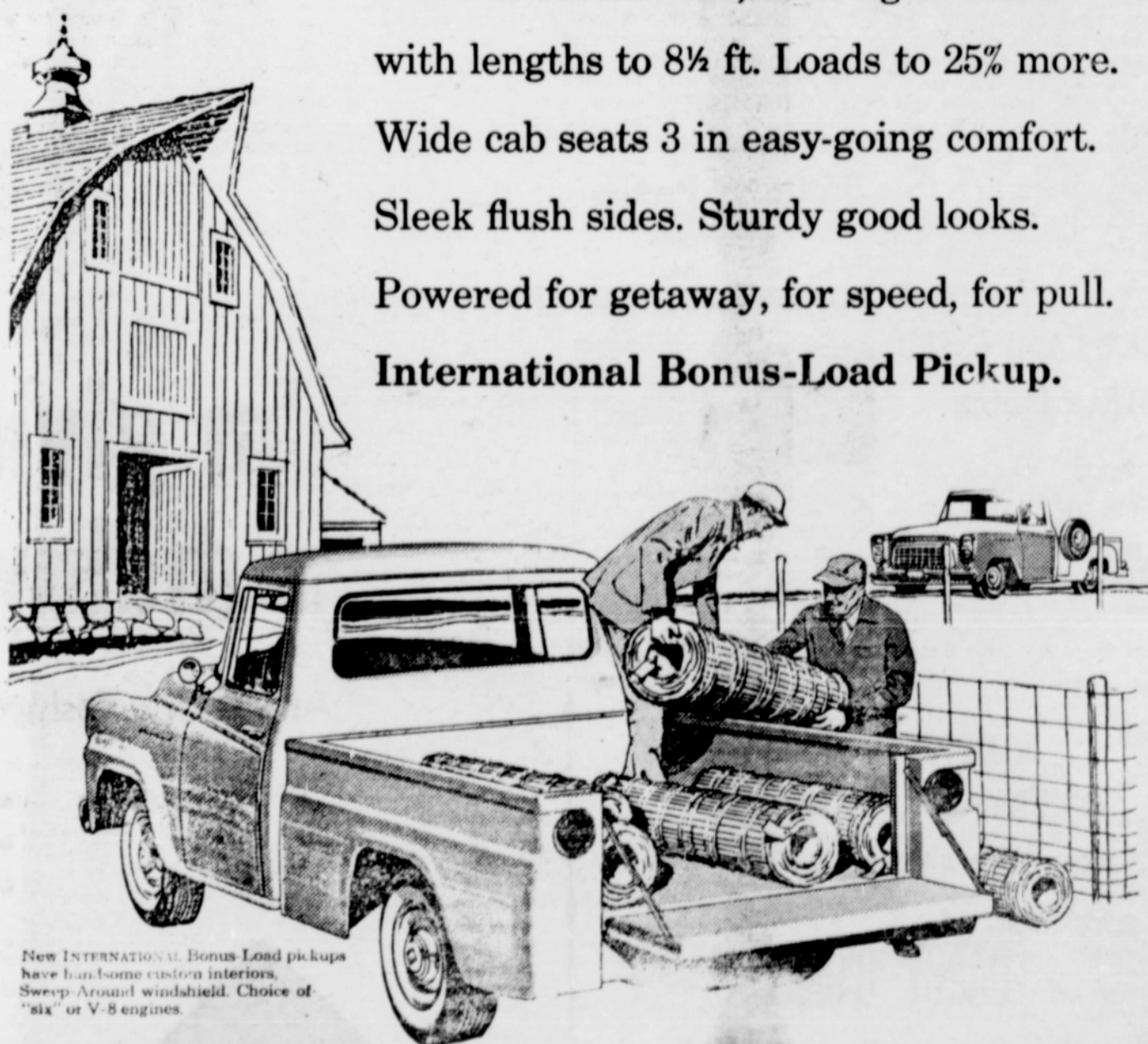
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
