Regulations Stiffer

Livestock from other states will find it a bit harder to enter Oregon as result of tightened requirements announced by the Oregon Department of Agriculture.

Henceforth, all out-of-state animals entering Oregon stockyards for other than slaughter purposes must be health tested in the first yard, unless they have met full health requirements prior to entry.

However, Oregon will accept cattle from clean herds in modified certified areas if they are accompanied by either an official health certificate or a written evidence of such clean status by authorized official of the state of origin. Authorized officials include brand inspectors, livestock officers and veterinarians.

Oregon will not accept swine which have been vaccinated with virulent live hog cholera virus. Also, horses must have health certificates and all show animals must meet all the health requirements.

These are chief changes in amendments signed November 30 to Oregon's livestock importation regulations. Copies may be obtained from the Department's division of animal industry, Salem.

Oregon In History

December 20, 1847—The provisional legislature has passed, and Governor Abernathy has approved, an act which appoints Joseph L. Meek as a special messenger to carry to Washington City and lay before President Polk such official communications as shall be handed to him by the legislature or the governor. A second act appropriates \$500 for expenses. Mr. Meek is to proceed by way of California. His going is made necessary by the recent massacre of the members of the Whitman mission. Mr. J. Quinn Thornton has already departed on a similar mission, having been sent forth by Governor Abernathy on his (the Governor's) own authority. Mr. Thornton's departure has caused suspicion to arise among the legislators that some deep-laid political plot is afoot, and Mr. Meek is sent to forestall same, as well as to ask assistance of the general government in the present Indian troubles.
