WE DISAGREE

We find ourselves in almost
complete disagreement with the
actions taken by the city council
last week and while that is not
unusual it is not often that we
feel moved to break into words
about it. This time we do.
The proposal to buy a \$10,000
fire truck is not new. Perhaps
we need it. But, if we are to re-
strict the use of the city funds
equipment to the city, as has been
suggested, the one we have is
adequate. If we are going to go
into the country, a fire control
district should be organized so all
those who use it can help pay for
it and help control it.
The proposal to dispense with the
maintenance man is not feasi-
ble considering the scarcity of
available labor to do the city jobs
on demand. It was done during
the war and members of the coun-
cil did much of the work them-
selves. We do not think that is a
likely possibility now.
The proposal to sign a contract
with a garbage collector may
have its points, but if it means
an exclusive contract it is not
good. Some prefer to dispose of
their own and will insist on the
city making such arrangements.

INFLATION

Some economists are saying
inflation as a threat to national
economy is done for a few years
and we wish we could believe it.
Inflation is so easy to bring
about for political purposes that
we are sure it will be used by
administrations desiring more
favorable conditions. The under-
standing of basic economics is so
slight that many cannot see the
danger of slicing cents off the
dollar, even though there is no
historical evidence that it has
been successful in any country
or at any time.
We even have a little inflation
at present although the growth in
prices has been very slight in the
past year. The growth the nation
makes with stable prices may be
merely wind. We are not im-
pressed with our huge gross na-
tional product figures and always
wonder what they would be un-
der normal conditions. Have we
produced more shirts and shoes
or only charged more for them?
It is as true that people get
the kind of education they want
as the kind of government they
want or deserve. If people want
athletics, manual training, sew-
ing, acting, that is what the
schools will teach. No way has
been found to make mental train-
ing very glamorous. It isn't edu-
cation that costs so much; it is
the training in things that please
parents.

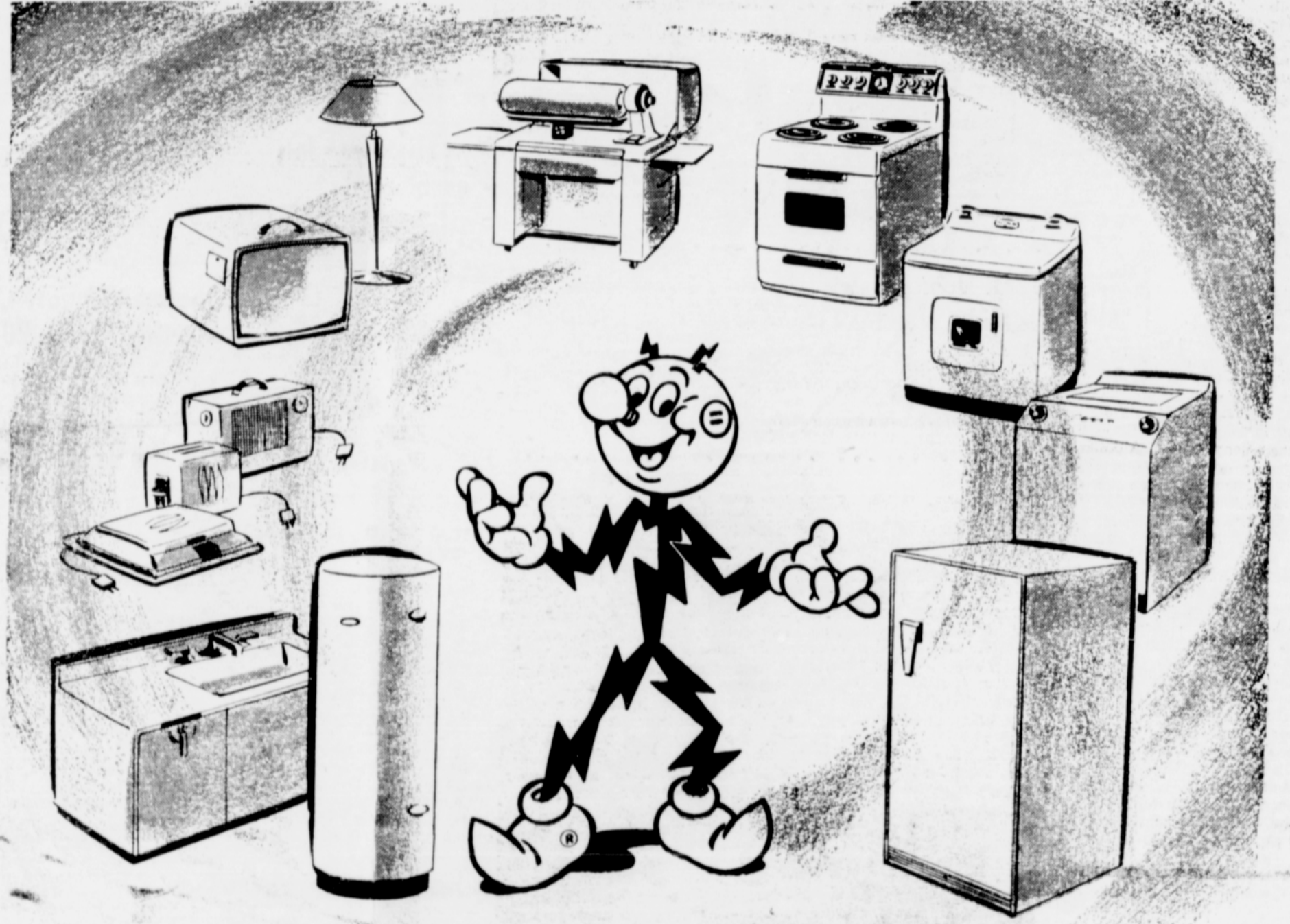
