DO SOMETHING

All this year we are going to be assailed by pleas from numerous groups to "do something." Translated in to common wordage that means that these groups are asking government to take over their problems and do something. Almost invariably it will cost money and almost invariably the petitioners will get it.

We have read pleas to do something about education, do something about mental health, do something about soil conservation, do something about junior colleges, do something about child delinquency, do something about a dozen things.

It all means that citizens are failing to do their duties as citizens and are trying to pass the buck to some one else, preferably a well financed section of government.

TOO MUCH ORGANIZATION

We read that less than 40 percent of the hogs butchered go through the big packing plants. They are being bought directly from farmers and killed closer to home.

There is good reason for it, of course. Such things don't happen unless there is a good reason. Shipping costs are one factor but the main reason is surely that the packing industry was over-organized, too highly centralized.

Some one just started doing the job cheaper. That is the penalty for building up an organization that is too big because it is nearly always too expensive.

cause there is competition. Unfortunately no way has been found to check the same tendency in government except to overturn the whole thing. Consequently the ills of government go unchecked for years and often the whole thing is upset to gain needed reformation.

IMITATION IS FLATTERY

While The Dalles is celebrating "be kind to neighbors week" because of a fancied slight from a Portland paper we hasten to join our river city friends with a similar celebration of our own.

We have previously mentioned the opposition of The Dalles to construction of the Biggs Rapids bridge. This was and will be an improvement to the area that The Dalles opposed for purely personal reasons. It was and is a much more serious deflection from the good neighbor code than the suggestion that the ship captain would be happy to complete his trip upriver.

Not to let our observance of the week fly on one wing we will call attention to a colored folder about The Dalles printed last year which shows Highway 97 coming to the Columbia at The Dalles bridge. Some time ago Wasco county renamed The Dalles-Criterion road Highway 197 in order to come as close to the number of our International Highway 97 as possible. Stealing the title as close as possible was had enough but now to steal the location is some thing about which a protest must be made.

So, while The Dalles is throwing rocks at Portland we offer a local diversion in the hope that an old saying will be recalled: "people who live in glass houses shouldn't throw stones."

CANCER CAUSES

Shelt Burres is interested in cancer and its cures. Proof, if necessary, is that Mr. Burres sold a ranch and donated \$20,000 to the cancer fund for research. He is constantly watching for news about the causes of cancer.

Most recent of these is a story about a study of cancer causes in New Zealand. Investigators compared the incidence of cancer among native New Zealanders who lived in pure air with that among emigrants from England who had spent a varied part of their lives in smog filled industrial towns.

Lung cancer was 30 percent higher among the Englishmen than among the New Zealanders and among emigrants from England who had spent most of their lives in the smog there was 75 percent more cancer.

Dr. David F. Eastcott, the investigator, concludes that lung cancer is a product of total environment-polluted air plays a part, smoking another part and infection and irritation are factors.
