SQUAW FARMING

There has never been any certainty about the best way to grow wheat in Sherman county. There has always been a most popular way, but there have always been dissenters. Dissenters used to be called squaw farmers. Years ago they raised two crops with one summer-fallowing and lately there has been encouragement for annual cropping.

The usual method is to plow with a moldboard in March or April spring tooth and rod weed until harvest, kill the growth in the fall and seed when possible. Fields so treated are clean of weeds, black and rich looking.

Squaw farming has the support of the federal government in this period. It has the aid of soil scientists. Neither make it blessed.

Yields are usually a little less under squaw farming, but the soil stays in place better and is more mellow, absorbs water easier and draws do not wash through it with every heavy rain. Early day advocates of a different kind of farming did not have good equipment, nor had they enough power. They had disc plows and double discs. All farmers who delve into theory refuse to burn stubble. But if not burned it creates a great problem. Squaw farming is the modern effort to keep the stubble on the land and farm in spite of it.

If conditions remain so farmers can continue trashy fallow, stubble mulch or squaw farming over a period of 20 years the advocates of it should have some definite results to show. Their draws should be smaller or gone entirely.

ly, their land should be mellow, their yields (assuming that all the land is farmed) should be better.

"In plain, simple words, grow up; quit being a cry-baby. Get out of your dream world and develop a backbone, out a wishbone, and start acting like a man or a lady.

"You're supposed to be mature enough to accept some of the responsibilities your parents have carried for years. They have nursed, protected, helped, appealed, begged, excused, tolerated and denied themselves needed comforts so that you could have every benefit. This they have done gladly for you are their dearest treasure. But now, you have no right to expect them to how to every whim and fancy just because selfish ego instead of common sense dominates your personality, thinking and requests.

"In Heaven's name, grow up and go home."
