cures there were none. Now farmers and we mean wheat farmers, of course, do have some serious troubles. Their price is declining as they build up a surplus and the cost of production keeps right on going up. A part of that is due to the tendency to take it easy after affluence sets in but costs are going up for the farmers the same as for every one else. The cost of machinery is high and labor and supplies. The set price, once fabulously high, has been rendered skimpy by rising costs.

Farmers who would like to farm to suit themselves are handicapped by government restrictions, a fact that is causing agriculture to lose its progress because of a lack of novelty.

Farmers are afraid of what might happen if all government programs were junked and well they might for the load of the surplus is huge. And while farmers created the surplus, it has been maintained and retained because of governmental inaction.

As we have said before the three main troubles of Sherman county farmers are: government, landlords, taxes. The government because of its meddling regulations, taxes because of the inefficiency big taxes cause, and landlords because of their demands.
