FEWER COUNTIES ????

Something Governor Hatfield said last week started a mild flurry of editorial opinion about the number of counties in Oregon. Senator Musa earned the lifelong enmity of Wheeler Countians by saying that Wheeler County might well be attached to others. (Someone should tell the senator that he is supposed to represent Wheeler County).

There is, of course, a type of mind that always likes to put its meddling fingers in other people's business. It may be done with the best of intentions or it may be done with malice aforethought. In any case it is a nuisance and sufficient cause for knuckle rapping.

Outside of this element we see no cause for any big argument about the number of counties. If legislative apportionment is to be conducted on an arithmetical basis counties of equal size would make the job easier, but that isn't the way to apportion legislators anyway. It is true that roads are better than when counties were established; it is true that as government grows there is more need for going to courthouses. Neither is a very pertinent argument.

Counties were established because citizens in a designated area wanted to be permitted to govern themselves. Often there were geographic reasons therefore (as in the case of Sherman) often a new county was set up because the old was too big (as in the case of Harney). It is our understanding that the will of the citizens concerned is of paramount importance and the opinion of would-be performers is not important.

The average county in the United States is 990 square miles and the average size in Oregon is roughly 2700 square miles. Small counties were once able to govern themselves more cheaply than bigger counties. That is not true now for the cost of county government and roads in this county is around \$60 per capita and in Wasco county it is \$20. There is a disinclination to petition bigger governments for help which can materially reduce cost of government by passing it on.

As long as a county can develop the interested citizenry to perform the function of county government with satisfaction to the residents that county should continue in existence. Neither size in area nor size in population should be a factor.

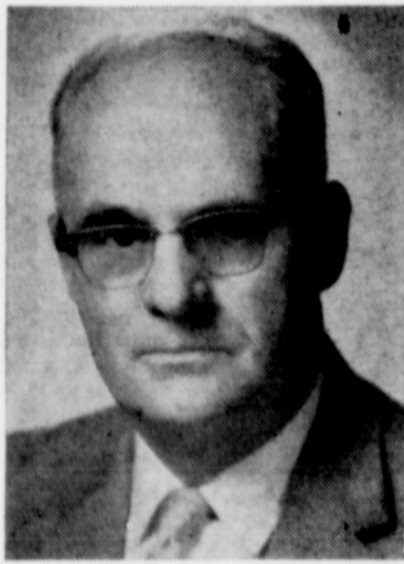
