Mrs. Paulen Kaseberg was elected president of the University of Mother's club at its annual meeting in Eugene this week.

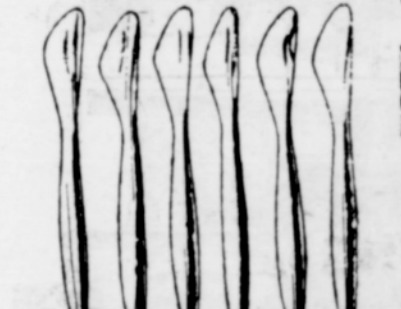

Dairy type baby calves \$10.00 to \$14.00 a head with beef breeds to \$45.00.

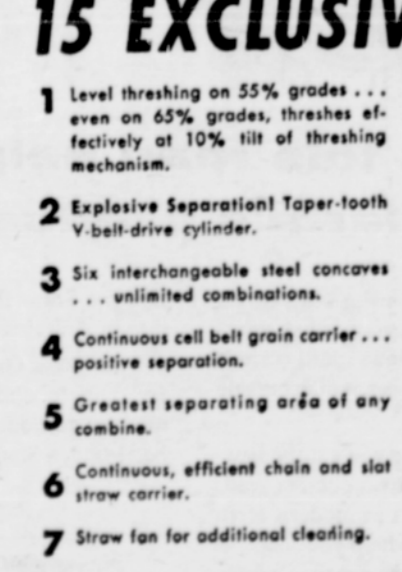
For the lecturers hour Jim McKinley of Nyssa an International Farm Youth exchange who spent six months in Jordan was present and gave a wonderful talk to those present.

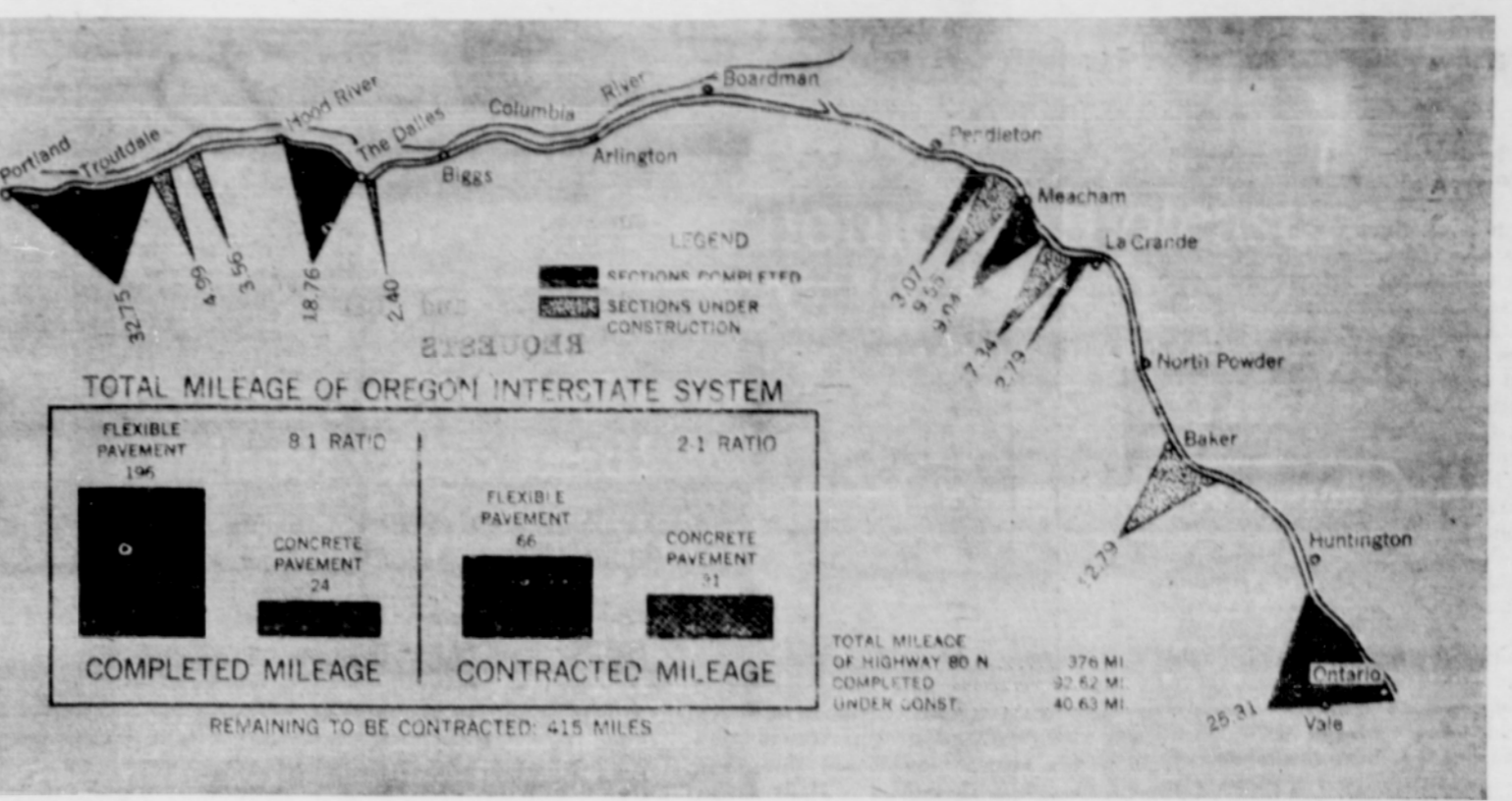

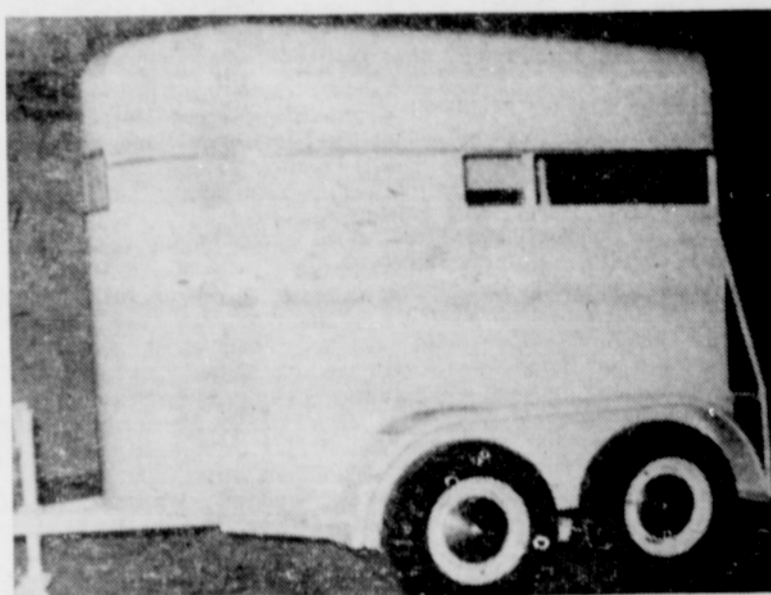
