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Nyssa Wins Meet 115 to 113 For Madras; SHS 3rd

The lean runners from Nyssa took the eastern Oregon A2 meet at Sherman last Saturday on a windy day similar to the previous Saturday but warmer. Score was 115 for Nyssa 113 for Madras, 65 1/2 Sherman, 61 Mac Hi, Enterprise 24, Burns 20 1/2, Elgin 14, Heppner 14, Grant Union 5 and Vale 1.

As a result of the meet six Sherman athletes will be in Corvallis Friday and Saturday for the A2 state meet, having first or second in an event. Gary Thompson will run in the 100 and 220, Ron Mobley will compete in the high jump and the discus, Robert Powell will run the mile, Byron Bayer the half mile and Bob Parker and Monte Axtell will help Thompson and Mobley in the relay. 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Marion Weatherford, a well known wheat and cattle grower of Arlington and a candidate for congress in the 1955 election will be the speaker at the June picnic of the Sherman County Historical society at DeMoss Springs, June 11.

Mr. Weatherford and his wife, past president of the Oregon Federated Women's clubs and member of the state fair board, went around the world on an extended trip three or four years ago. He is past president of the Oregon Wheat Growers League and of the wheat commission.

He has been a lifelong resident of Gilliam County and a member of a family with varied accomplishments outside of farming. His grandfather came across the plains in the 1840s barefoot so he would have a good pair of shoes on hand when he reached the promised land of Oregon.

The topic for his talk has not been announced but it will be one with bearing on local history and the present political and economic situation of this area.

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
