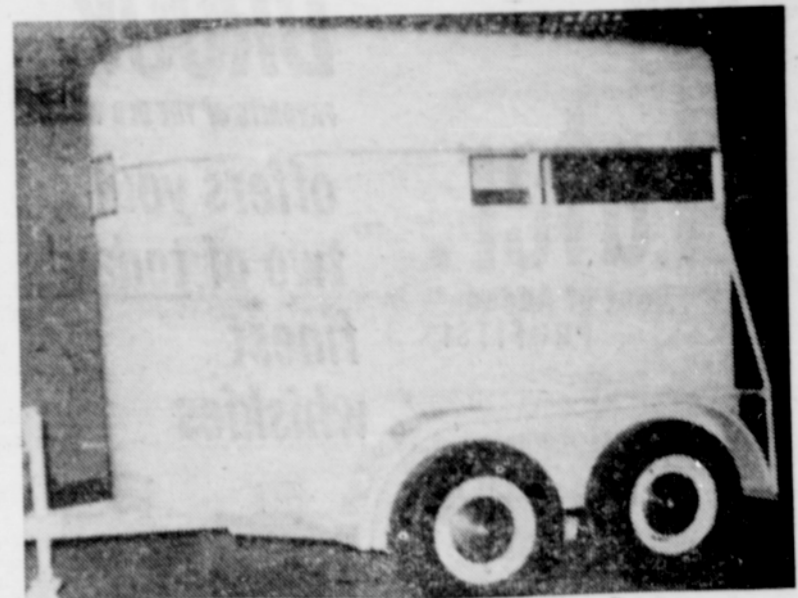
On Agriculture Rolland Johnson reported the red rust which is in the wheat this year in Sher-
