MARKET REPORT

Livestock receipts totaled 287 head. Both cattle and hogs sold 50c to \$1.00 higher than a week previous. U. S. No. 1 and 2 butcher hogs, 180-230 lbs. brought \$17.75 to \$18.80. Sows sold higher at \$11.00 to \$12.50 on heavy weights and up to \$15.00 on light demand at \$7.50 to \$13.50 a head. Good feeder steers 500 to 600 lbs. brought \$22.50 to \$24.50 with medium kinds at \$19.00 to \$22.00. Good heifers 400 to 600 lbs. \$20.25 to \$23.00 with light heifer calves up to \$28.00. Common heifers \$17.00 to \$20.00. Good calves 200 to 300 lbs. \$26.00 to \$28.00 a cwt. common calves \$22.00 to \$25.00 and thin calves \$18.00 to \$22.00 a cwt.
