Elwin Rasmussen and family came up from Hood River Tuesday to help his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Al Rasmussen celebrate the

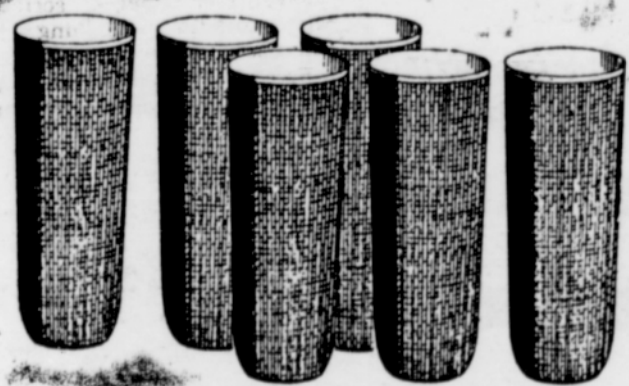

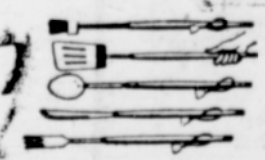

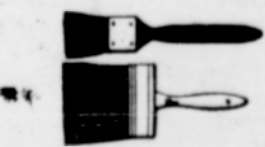
