SHERMAN OLIVER'S BOOK

Sherman countians will be interested in a book written by Herman Oliver known to many, and known about by all, who is the first citizen of Grant county where he was successful stockman, generous donor of a library and museum, member of the Board of Higher Education and State Highway commission. Herman wrote the book and E. R. Jackman edited it.

It is a book for men, not as a differentiation as to sex, but as to spiritual independence. It is an autobiography in the old American style, a story of independence, of standing on one's own feet, of learning and applying knowledge. It will do people good to read it.

Originator of the Oliver clan was a Portuguese stowaway from the Azore Islands who walked from The Dalles to Canyon City in the gold rush of the 1860s, who married a stout German girl and bought a quarter section on time and proceeded to make a fortune, based on peddling milk and vegetables to miners who dug up the fertile earth in search of the glamorous metal. That simple fact is something to contemplate.

If success be the development of one's self to the ultimate of his abilities this book proclaims Herman Oliver a success without regard to his one time ownership of half of 54,000 acres of well managed range land, his carefully managed bank which was able to get through the depression without foreclosing on a single stockman, his long service on state boards. In hard winters he often had hay to sell to neighbors—at cost.

It is not a boastful book. But Herman has lived 76 years, is of the generation that has seen more than any other in history, has had time and inclination to think while riding over his wide range and has put it down in a sense of pride and duty. Jackman shoved the words around to fit the rules because Herman didn't learn many rules about words in his brief schooling while Jack left a ranch in Montana to go to school at Bozeman so he knows quite a bit about both cattle and words.

It is a book to be read over and referred to again and again especially when one's faith in America runs low, when one forgets that it is men—citizens—who make the country not government nor it's servants.
