Portland Host City For Japan-American Meeting

Portland, Oregon will be host city for the Sixth Japan-American Conference of Mayors and Chamber of Commerce Presidents to be held Sept. 17-21.

The conference, which promotes mutual understanding and friendship through free discussion and studies of common problems, is of great importance to all areas of the Columbia Basin and the Portland Empire because of its bearing on the free trade and commerce between the Columbia Basin and American ports.

Representatives from Oregon, Washington, California, Idaho, Hawaii and Alaska, as well as 19 Japanese cities, have been invited to attend.

Held every two years since 1951, the conference met last in Osaka, Japan in 1959.

This will mark the first time that Portland has been host city and is recognition of the key role played by its major world seaport as distribution center for the vast Columbia Basin and Inland Empire.

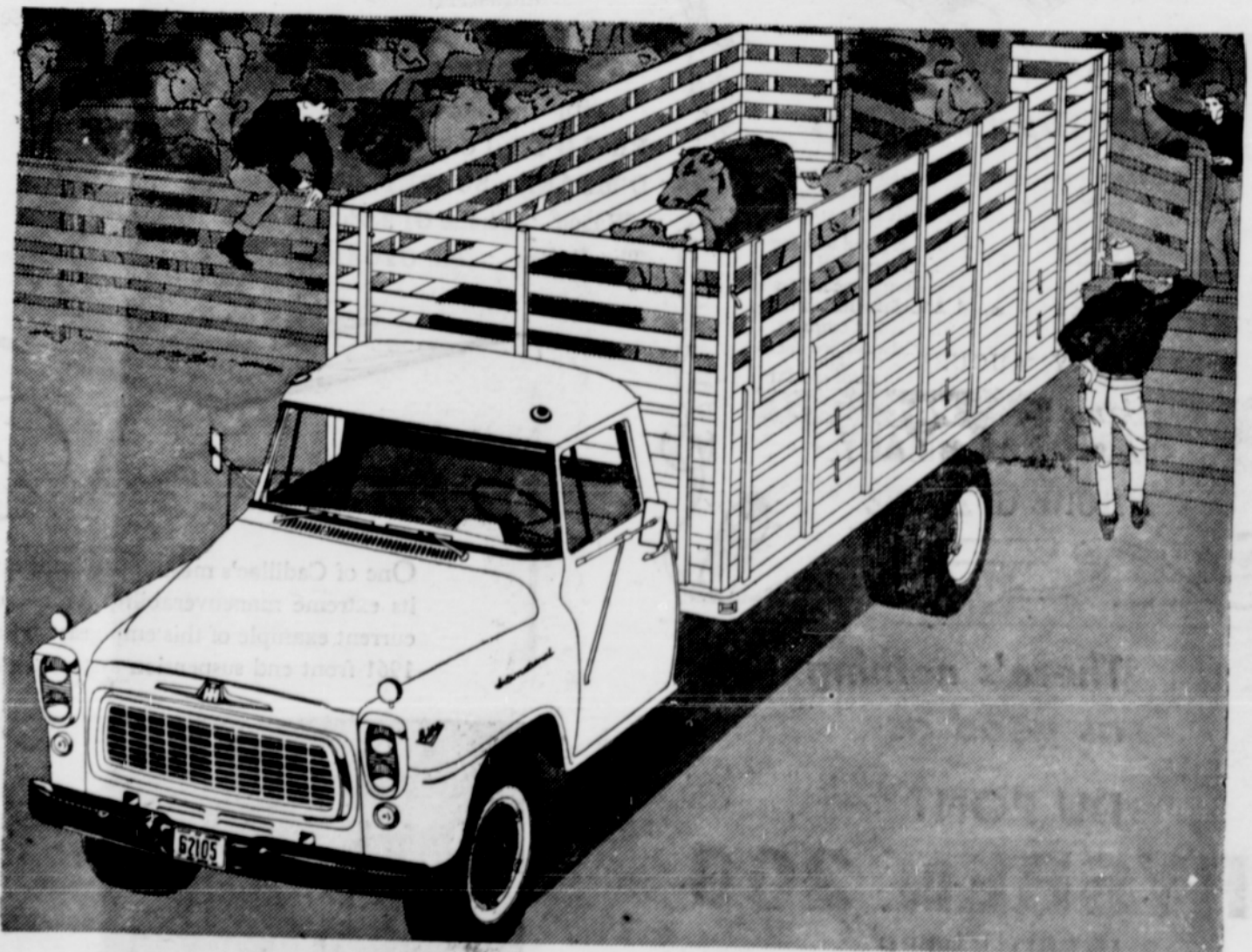
