DON'T GET TOO TIRED WHEN DRIVING
Fatigue behind the wheel of a car is one of the primary traffic dangers this time of year, according to the Oregon department of Motor Vehicles.
The department said accidents often result from fatigue-reduced driving efficiency even where the driver does not fall asleep at the wheel.
It quoted Harvard University research which has revealed that early stages of fatigue find a driver making the right response to a situation, but at the wrong time. Later fatigue stages find him thinking he's driving well while he's actually operating in a dangerous manner—similar to the middle stages of a drinking driver. Harvard found such drivers responding to individual aspects of the driving situation rather than to the total problem.
It's a life and death matter in all stages of fatigue, the department said.
Before deciding to take a long drive, motorists were asked to analyze the amount and quality of recent rest. If worn out by exercise or emotional stress, or if sleep was poor the previous night, the department suggested that driving be put off until conditions improve.
It emphasized that Harvard re-

search was clear that tiredness is too subtle to be based only on the number of hours behind the wheel without figuring in both physical and psychological factors.

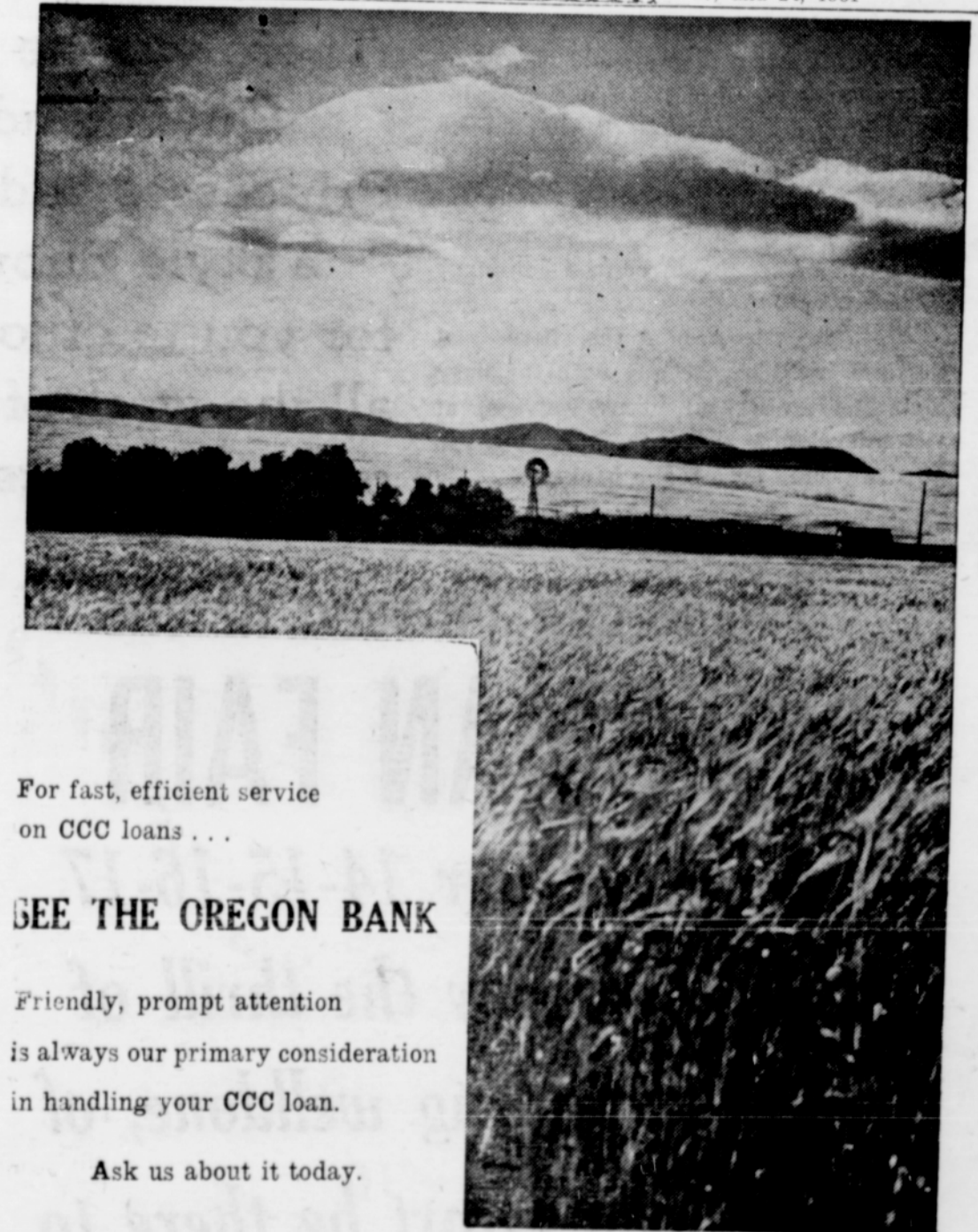

Portland Host City For Japan-American Meeting
Portland, Oregon will be host city for the Sixth Japan-American Conference of Mayors and Chamber of Commerce Presidents to be held Sept. 17-21.
The conference, which promotes mutual understanding and friendship through free discussion and studies of common problems, is of great importance to all areas of the Columbia Basin and the West Coast because of its bearing on the free trade and commerce between the Columbia Basin and American ports.
Representatives from Oregon, Washington, California, Idaho, Hawaii and Alaska, as well as 19 Japanese cities, have been invited to attend.
Held every two years since 1951, the conference met last in Osaka, Japan in 1959.
This will mark the first time that Portland has been host city and is recognition of the key role played by its major world seaport as a distribution center for the West Coast Columbia Basin and Inland Empire.
