**REAPPORTIONMENT**

The five man committee named by Senator Harry Bolvin, acting as chairman of the group of legislators from eastern Oregon, has announced a tentative plan for reapportionment of the legislature.

We must say that it is about what we expected and may further say that it will cure no primary ailments, hardly be a band-aid to a seriously fractured leg. For this area it retains the senate division of Hood River, Wasco, Sherman, Gilliam, Morrow, and Wheeler into one senatorial district. It gives a representative to Sherman, Gilliam and Morrow.

The senate is increased to 33 and the house to 65.

Although the statement accompanying the scheme says consideration was given area this cannot be proven by the distributor itself. That shows that basically population is the background for the apportionment.
