FARM BILL

Russia, we learn, is having a hard time feeding its population. The reason is that its agriculture has been taken away from the farmers and turned over to a bunch of Moscow bureaucrats. The United States, we understand, has a big surplus of farm products that are costing the government money to store. Its government plans to turn the management over to bureaucrats.

Government control of agriculture will work the same in both countries and if congress gives government authority over food production it will not be long before this country will be as hungry as Russia. And any nation that would commit so foolish an error had ought to be hungry—and certainly will.

It had to happen, we suppose that eventually a mere politician would be appointed head of the agriculture department and try to take control of farm production into his own untrained hands.

The farm program has grown consistently worse and after thirty years it is getting pretty bad. Farmers have less freedom, can use less independence in methods of farming and worst of all from their viewpoint have less income. The government has failed as a manager of farm production just as it has failed in Russia.

There is no chance that congress will be wise enough to stop the whole mess; the only chance is that enough farmers will rebel to put a stop to it. Whether the government would be venal enough to use its threat to turn loose the surplus on the market we don't know, but we doubt it.
