OF SCHOOLS

There are no schools this week, giving pupils a rest from teachers and teachers some respite from pupils, both of which may be helpful. Teachers loyal to their union may attend the Oregon Education association meetings in Portland this week and hear a group of college professors tell them the advantages of more college training.

They will be indoctrinated in the philosophy of the union which is that pupils are increasing and costs are going up and there is nothing at all taxpayers can do about it. No changes will be made in methods of teaching but there will be increases in teacher salaries. (Teachers are not the only ones preaching the helplessness of taxpayers.)

Other countries have long ago learned to divide pupils into classifications so that every one need not be given the same type of education, but we keep right on trying to crowd educational subjects into the heads of those who want nothing but mechanical skills. The division is made at about eleven in most countries.

We keep on giving diplomas for typewriting, cake baking, nail pounding, and horn tooting, none of which have any educational value at all. But in a democracy the argument runs, everybody is entitled to a diploma to hang on his wall.

There will be no relaxing of teacher certification rules as long as they are in the hands of the teachers themselves even though indirectly under the school superintendent. The idea is to keep the numbers down just as the pilots union refuses to train pilots in adequate numbers. The idea that a girl needs a college education to teach the multiplication table is as fanciful as the theory that vitamins will make hair grow on the head. But colleges adhere to the educational monopoly.

There are lots of things wrong with schools and most teachers with perception know it. But the public is constantly told that all ills could be cured with more money when reform will never come until there is too little money. Then parents will start to think.

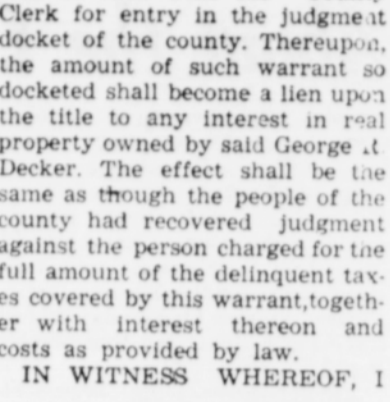
