**COUNTY CHARTER**  
 There has been but little discussion of the proposed county charter although the county club held a program about it last month. A small percentage of the voters attended the meeting.

The details of the charter seem unimportant to us. Like charters being voted on in other counties such details can be changed right here in the county when desired. Without a charter we are subject to state laws that cannot be changed except during legislative sessions and seldom then because of a lack of representation for small counties.

It may be said that this county has no government, certainly it has no right to make laws. The county court is an administrative body with control of nothing but some aspects of the road program. Under a charter system charter counties would soon acquire control over many aspects of county affairs like herd laws, grazing districts, weed control along with the right to make legislation regarding its own internal management.

Adoption of a county charter would be a step toward independence.

**LEGISLATIVE SALARIES**  
 This seems a particularly inopportune time for Oregon legislators to ask for the privilege of setting their own salaries. Anyone will admit that the pay for making the state's laws is very low in fact, it costs a legislator between three and four thousand dollars to go to a session. Certainly the job should be worth the expenses involved and perhaps the voters would approve a bill providing adequate pay but to throw the door open to the kind of legislators now in office should find little favor.

A legislature that pre-empted the duties of the highway commission and passed something over \$50 million dollars in bond issues on the highway fund, mainly for an expensive and almost useless bridge across the Columbia at Astoria should not be trusted with its hands in the taxpayer's pockets.

A legislature that passed an ambulance bill for the whole state that was only workable in the major cities did not exercise the judgment expected of mature and thoughtful citizens.

A legislature that can find no solution to the state's problems but greatly increased state expenditures is so deficient in imagination and ability as to cast doubt on the size of the pay it now receives.

When we have a legislature that represents the people instead of the state's bureaucracy the time will be better to discuss additional pay.
