Home Garden Insect Pests Several early-season insect pests will soon be trying to get the jump on the home gardener for use of his produce.

Practically all vegetables are subject to attack by aphids. Radishes and turnips are frequently injured by flea beetles. Malathion is the recommended control.

Cutworms are a frequent problem in home gardens. Baits or DDT dust or spray may be used to control them.

All seedling plants should be protected against slugs. Baits or dusts containing metaldehyde are effective controls.

Peas should be dusted or sprayed at weekly intervals as they come into bloom for protection against pea weevils. Object is to kill adult weevils before they lay eggs on developing pods. After eggs are laid, there's no way to prevent "weevily peas". DDT, methoxychlor, or malathion are recommended controls.

Maggots are major pests of stem or leafy-type crucifers such as cabbage, cauliflower, and broccoli. Dust or ring around the base of each plant as you set them out with aldrin or chlordane dust.

Fertilizing Home Lawns Many home gardeners intend on keeping that fresh green color in their lawns are already eyeing the fertilizer sack and spreader—especially if they didn't fertilize last fall.

Nitrogen is the main fertilizer need for well-established turf with little response from either phosphate or potash. Application of phosphate or sulfur encourages growth of clover in lawns.

Recommended fertilizer rate is one pound of actual nitrogen per 1000 square feet of lawn. Minimum treatment is at least three applications a year, and the maximum treatment is one application a month during the growing season.
