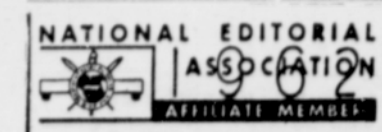

WE OBJECT
The Oregon Journal last week carried a four part story about a new federal give-away program called Area Redevelopment Administration in which, the story said, eight Oregon counties may be included. What should have been surprising is that Sherman

county was listed among them. To qualify counties had to be declared a distressed or redevelopment area meaning that there was less than normal employment in the area or the family income was under \$1857 a year or the farm income below \$1415. The department of Labor, Interior and Agriculture assisted the department of Commerce in making the designation.

Sherman county does not qualify. It is probably the richest county in the United States, with prosperous and efficient wheat growers, regular employment for everyone able and willing to work. We object to being included in any such poor house project. There was brief mention of the project for which this county was included, but it appears to be jointly with Wasco county for an automated feed lot and slaughter facility near The Dalles. For this the counties seek a paltry \$5500 and the story said it would create 100 jobs immediately.

We wonder what has come over this county when it would apply

for federal aid for a miserable \$5500 jointly with well to do Wasco county. There are a dozen wheat growers who could put up the whole thing and find it a convenient tax gimmick.

Furthermore we wonder what this county is doing planning a feed lot project that should be a private business and not handicapped by federal management.

The major weakness of Wasco county has been the bad habit of running to Washington for everything. Such a habit has cost the county its self reliance. We do not want Sherman county to develop the same weakness.

Wasco county is not as wealthy as Sherman county but it does not lack for money. By begging from the federal government it has lost its pride, it will, its determination, until its citizens are becoming paupers without evidence of its once fine pioneer spirit.

That is Wasco's county's business. But when it inveigles Sherman county to follow its supine policy that is our business and we object to having our county listed among the spiritual paupers without the will to do things for itself, even when already endowed with ample funds.
