Sermon theme: "Building the Home God Meant"

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At a double ring ceremony performed Sunday, August 26 at 2 p.m. at The Dalles First Methodist church, Miss Shirley Elaine Watkins, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Francis L. Watkins of Wasco, became the bride of Orville Blaylock, of Grass Valley, the service being read by the Rev. John L. McMurtrey of Wasco.

Preceding the ceremony Charles May of The Dalles sang, "Thru the Years" and at close, "The Lord's Prayer". Organist was William Clothier of Seattle, Wash.

Given in marriage by her father, the bride wore a gown of taffeta and embroidered alencon lace. The filled bodice had a scalloped sobrina neckline and wrist-length tapered sleeves of alencon lace which was enriched with seed pearls. The bouffant taffeta skirt

with chapel length train was accented by a huge taffeta flower at the rear waistline over the traditional buttoned back. The 14 karat gold diamond pendant, worn with the bridal gown, was a gift from the groom. Her pouf veil of silk illusion, elbow length, fell from scalloped circle crown trimmed with seed pearls. She carried a cascade bouquet of stephanotis, agapanthus lilies and white roses. She carried an heirloom handkerchief first carried by her maternal great-grandmother, Andrea Rasch, when carried in 1887 in Bornholm, Denmark. With this she wore white gloves, matching lavender heels and headpiece of silk organza and taffeta flowers held by a nose veil with three small flowers on the veil. She carried a cascade bouquet of mint green spider mums.

The sanctuary was beautifully decorated with mint green spider mums, mint green and lavender glads with mint green bows. Two pair of candleabra used near the altar had mint green spiral candles and mint green and lavender flower arrangements.

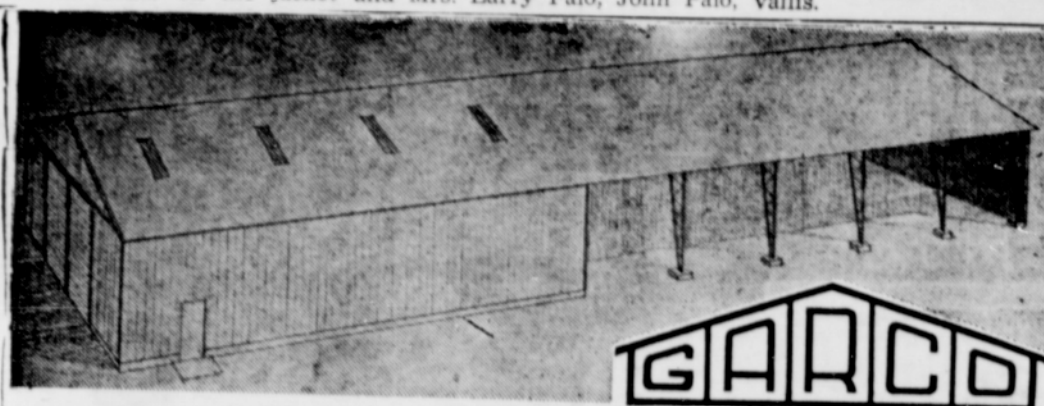
For going away, Mrs. Blaylock wore a capri blue wool suit with a mink fur collar on the jacket
