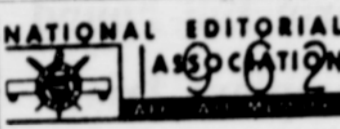

**THE TEMPTATION**

Mr. Tom Current, field coordinator of the Area Redevelopment Administration, has written a letter saying that Sherman county has been linked with Wasco county in The Dalles Labor Market Area and has therefore been included in the ARA designation as unemployment. The actual figures for neither county are given.

But money has been granted for a research project to put money into one of the nation's most prosperous areas when some research should have been done before this county was included. Rich counties should not be called poor. Nor should they accept aid under false pretences.

The research for a stock feeding project has been done in Umatilla county and need not be repeated here. The USDA and OSU sent out a news release that was published in this paper last week saying that Sherman, Gilliam and Morrow were the most prosperous counties in the state.

If the citizens of Sherman—of their own volition—want to find out about stock feeding they are capable of doing so, have the money to do so and would do it better and quicker and cheaper than if "aided" by the federal government. The same applies to Wasco county.

The whole scheme is designed to force federal aid into an area that doesn't need it. This nation has been so weakened by such ill-advised political give-aways that it verges on bankruptcy. We do not want the responsibility of that. We want Sherman county removed from the list of needy counties. It does not belong there; it was put there through dishonesty or lack of information; it should be relieved of the disgrace.

**FORK BARREL POLITICS**

We are not sure that we think that the getting of money by his state is the correct way to judge a United States senator. That seems to be coming to be an issue in the present campaign. Morse and his supporters who are boasting of the big appropriations he gets overlook the fact that most of the money has gone on the Columbia river and Senator Warren Mangunsen is largely responsible for them, not Morse.

The argument against Morse isn't that he fails to get money. It is that he fails to make friends. He rants and raves against everyone in turn, Republicans, Democrats, conservatives, liberals, all must share a part of the abuse handed out by this supreme egoist. The one exception is the labor leaders. They keep him in office.

Oregon voters have a chance to elect a different kind of a man this year in Sig Unander, a big Swede and grandson of that famed Oregon citizen, Simon Benson. Sig knows how to get along with people, seldom calls names, has stud-

**People's Column**

To the Editor:

In the past few days, I have received two letters from Sherman County, as well as your editorial. The substance of the above is that Sherman county should not be designated by the Area Redevelopment Administration and the request that it be de-designated. The reasons cited are the generally high average income of the county, the prosperous wheat and cattle industries, the self-reliance of the citizens and the reluctance to be identified as receiving government assistance.

I am sending a letter with the same content as this one to the others mentioned above. My purpose is to point out a few salient facts for your consideration.

Designation of areas as to whether they are eligible to participate in the ARA program is based on statistical unemployment and under-employment data for labor market areas. The Dalles Labor Market Area was designated by the Area Redevelopment Administration. The fact that The Dalles Labor Market Area includes area encompassed by both Wasco and Sherman Counties accounts for the designation. Separate data for the counties is not available.

This should not disturb anyone because it is merely a statistical device for determining who can make use of our program. The decision as to whether to make use of the program is up to individuals and groups in the area.

I don't believe use of the program conflicts with any philosophical or social considerations. Your fear that it would undermine the self-reliance of the people of Sherman County should be dispelled by the fact that we are only intended to be used by local people in their own boot-strap economic development efforts.

Communities have experimented with broadly based development organizations, with development corporations to invest money to attract or create new payrolls or expand local payrolls, with economic self analysis and action programs to move local areas ahead.

It was against this backdrop of community experience that the Area Redevelopment Act techniques were devised. Simply stated, we are intended to assist local areas which wish to use the experience of many local groups across the country in local development programs.

The word "assist" may be causing some misunderstanding. In the case of ARA, it certainly does not imply a "hand-out". It does mean that repayable loans are available to help take advantage of economic opportunities and create employment opportunities. It does mean that we are trying to do a better job of making regular government functions available to local development groups to speed up economic activity.

The type of economic development desired is to be defined by local people. It need not mean smokestacks if that is not what is desired.

For example, ARA has approved for Sherman County a technical assistance project which we hope will break an information roadblock to more comprehensive agricultural industry development. A small grant has been made for an automated feedlot study, but it should be noted that private capital is ready to go ahead if it appears feasible. I would say that this is a proper, encouraging and venturesome partnership between government and the community to advance Sherman County's economy to the benefit of all concerned.

It is simply not realistic to deny the need for government services, especially in the West. Government here is a trustee of many technicians and programs which become involved in economic development. By their nature, navigation and other water resource problems and potentials involve government. Government is intended to be used by citizens in promotion of the interests of an area.

As far as ARA funds are concerned, they are not available unless the area participates financially in the program, and they are available only according to the desires and action planning of the area. Ours is road-block breaking money. We will gladly step aside wherever the financial community can do the job. We are no substitute for local action—we are only a supplement to be

used when, where and as the community meets problems. Our requirement for being used in this way is no more than the requirement that the area projects be feasible and that the area participate to its maximum ability.

When the unemployment and under-employment statistic situation warrants The Dalles Labor Market Area will be de-designated. I hope that it will not be too long before this can be done. I am encouraged by the spirit shown by the area committee and by the projects which are in the process of being formulated. The contacts I have had with people in Sherman County indicate that they are interested in promoting the economy of the County. They generally seem to feel that more development is possible if they work at it. This does not seem to me to be in conflict with the de-

sires of those who are presently employed or presently engaged in enterprises which are doing well financially. Additional progress would be welcomed by all I should think.
