Rufus News

Friday visitors last week of the Leonard Jordan's were Mr. Jordan's cousin and husband, Mr. and Mrs. R. A. Natalizio, who stopped on their way to Portland to spend a three month vacation. They had landed in New York eight days previously, having flown in from Tehran, Saudi Arabia, where Mr. Natalizio is employed by the American-Arabian Oil Company.

Mrs. Leonard Jordan, the Rufus postmaster, has sent out notices to all the patrons telling them the rules of the holiday mail. She states, "Do not wait till the last minute to mail your Christmas mail." The mails are congested at this time and it takes more than a week for a parcel to cross the U. S. in normal times. Pack and wrap and tie your parcels well. You are the one responsible for the arrival condition. Keep seals off the address side of the mail. Address one side only. Do not use address labels. They fall off and the parcel winds up in the dead parcel post office unclaimed. Put an address inside parcel as a safety measure if you wish. Enclose no message in parcel without declaring the enclosure and paying for it. Do not write a message in your unsealed Christmas cards (no matter how short.) Three cents will take your unsealed, unwritten cards to anywhere in the U. S. or possessions or Canada or Mexico. But, they are treated as waste paper if they are not deliverable at the address to which you send them. If in doubt put a four cent stamp and your return address on envelope. They will be forwarded or returned to you. Put your return address on envelopes and all mail in the upper left hand corner. Shop early for your stamps and stamp and address your cards at home, where you will have room to work. The cards put into bundles of local or outgoing. These labels are available at your postoffice. Incoming mail at Rufus is 9:00 a. m. and outgoing mail 4:30 p. m. with

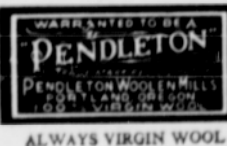

HOW TO KILL CHEATGRASS AND OTHER WINTER WEEDS IN GRAIN STUBBLE
