Annual SCD Meeting

The Sherman Soil Conservation district annual meeting has been set for February 7, courthouse, at Moro. The program is being arranged by the local supervisors.

White muscle disease continues to take a heavy toll of lambs and calves from Oregon livestock producers. This disease will strike in most regions of the state. It may be prevented by injecting the mother or the offspring with an injection of selenium. The cost is extremely low when related to the savings through reducing lamb or calf crops. The material is available in all parts of the state and may be given by the livestock producer.

Oregon's Agricultural Progress

The winter issue of Oregon State University Agriculture Experiment stations publication entitled Oregon's Agricultural Program was mailed this week. The magazine is received by thousands of farm and agri-business people over the state.

This month's issue has articles on Oregon's property tax, saving runt pigs, rust control for grass seed crop and others. The magazine is general reports results of research work in Oregon.

Oregon residents may be placed on the mailing list by writing to the Bulletin Clerk, OSU, Corvallis 24-D Legislation.

Joint wheat league and Milton Freewater committee has developed recommendations on further control of 2,4-D in Oregon. The recommendations developed will be presented to the OWG league executive meeting January 16 at Pendleton. Proposals will probably be introduced in the Oregon legislature whether approved by the league officials or not.

Proposed regulations are:

1. Isopropyl ester of 2,4-D and its volatility equivalents in the state of Oregon be restricted for two years.

2. Butyl ester of 2,4-D be restricted in the present secondary restricted area. If further damage results in the horticulture area, restrictions be extended to all of Umatilla county.

3. No spraying be done with winds exceeding 15 miles per hour.

4. Request Washington to restrict isopropyl ester of 2,4-D in adjacent counties.

Purple Mustard

Purple mustard has appeared on early fall plantings. This weed has shown considerable resistance to 2,4-D at later stages of growth. For best control treat with 34 pound of 2,4-D ester. If purple mustard is more than 4 or 5 inches across, treat with 1 to 1 1/2 pounds of 2,4-D per acre.
