**IN THE COUNTY COURT OF THE STATE OF OREGON FOR THE COUNTY OF SHERMAN**

In the Matter of Calling a Special Election to Vote Special Tax Levies for a Five Year Period Commencing with the Fiscal Year 1963-1964 for the Purpose of Permanent Road Improvement:

**ORDER:**

On this 3rd day of April, 1963, the above entitled Court being in regular session for the transaction of county business, said day being the first day of the regular April Term and the matter of building, improving and maintaining the permanent roads of said county being under consideration; and

It appearing to the Court that the annual tax levy within the constitutional limitation is insufficient to furnish the necessary funds to build, improve and maintain the roads of the county on a permanent, sound and lasting basis and that the general condition of the roads is becoming worse each year because of this lack of funds; and

It further appearing to the Court that such a program of road building, improvement, and maintaining should be started immediately and be continued for a period of five years and

It further appearing to the Court that in order to carry out such a program ad valorem taxes should be levied serially—outside of the limitation imposed by section 11, Article XI, Oregon Constitution, in the amount of \$45,000.00 each year for a period of five years commencing with the tax year 1963-1964 and ending with the tax year 1967-1968, the total levies and outlay for said purpose to be the sum of \$225,000.00; and

It further appearing to the Court that the matter of making such tax levies should be submitted to the legal and qualified voters of Sherman County at a special election—

It is hereby ORDERED that a Special Election be held in Sherman County, Oregon, on Friday, the 17th day of May, 1963, between the hours of 8:00 o'clock A.M. and 8:00 o'clock P.M. at the regular and usual polling places, at which special election there shall be submitted to the electors of Sherman County, Oregon, the question of whether ad valorem taxes shall be levied serially—outside of the limitation imposed by section 11, Article XI, Oregon Constitution, in the amount of \$45,000.00 each year for a period of five years, commencing with the tax year 1963-1964 and ending with the tax year 1967-1968, for total tax levies of \$225,000.00 during said five year period, the funds to be provided by the said tax levies to be used in building, improving and maintaining the permanent roads of the county.

It is further ORDERED that the County Clerk be, and she is hereby authorized and directed to prepare the necessary election notices and to cause the question of said special tax levies to be placed on the ballot at a special election to be held in Sherman County, Oregon, on May 17, 1963.

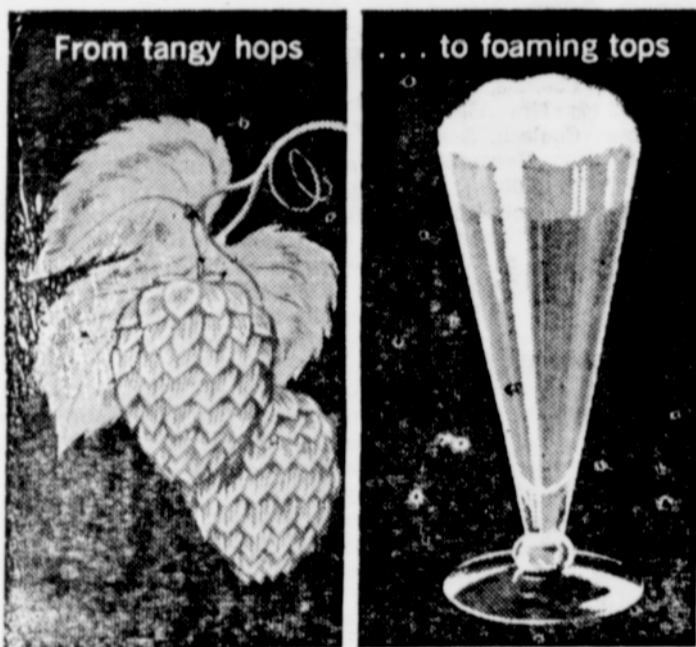

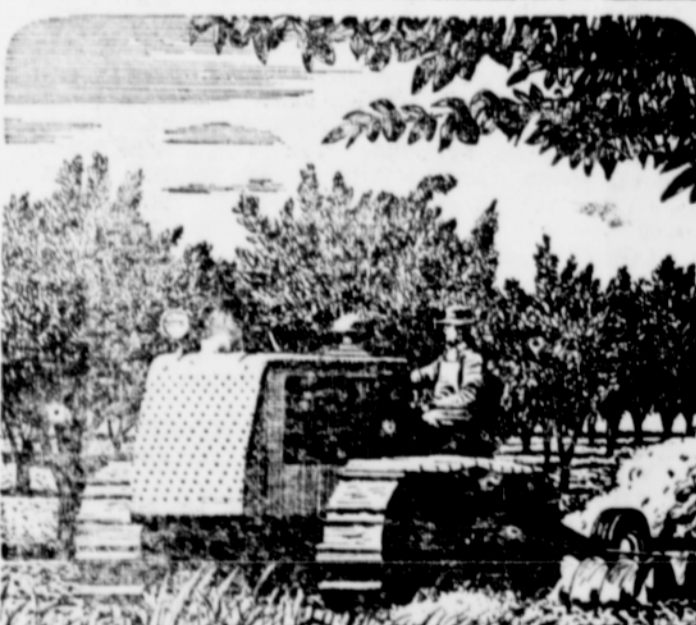
