

Clean Water Campaign Given Okay By F of WC

"Women, performing their ordinary household tasks, contribute to the problem of water pollution in this country. They must also contribute to its solution," said Mrs. Dexter Otis Arnold, president of the General Federation of Women's Clubs, today as she endorsed the Clean Water Campaign of the U.S. Public Health Service.

She pointed to the growing use of chemical cleaners in the home and their disposal as only one small danger to our waters. "Now, we are beginning to get evidence we can see of material creeping into our water supply which should not be there.

"If we are to continue to grow and prosper as a nation," Mrs. Arnold said, "we must assure ourselves that we will always have a supply of clean water for industries, our farms, our homes, and our recreational areas."

Mrs. Arnold urged all women's clubs in this country to learn all they can about water pollution problems in their states and localities and cooperate with local and state agencies in programs to cut down on pollution.

Rural Housing Loans Will Help Families, Builders and Dealers

Rural Housing loans are now available to owners of non-farm tracts in rural areas and in rural communities of not more than 2,500 population.

Rural Housing loans will not only help families obtain better homes but will put more carpenters, plumbers, and electricians to work, and will increase the sales in lumber yards and building firms.

Housing loans are made for the construction, repair, and remodeling of dwellings and essential farm buildings and to provide water for farmstead and household use.

In addition to major construction funds are available to modernize homes—add bathrooms, central heating, modern kitchens, and other home improvements, as well as to enlarge and remodel farm service buildings and put in related facilities such as paved feedlots, yard fences, and driveways.

A senior citizen may use loan funds to buy a previously occupied house or to buy a site on which to build his home as well as to build or repair a home on land he owns. To qualify as a senior citizen, a person must be 62 years of age or older.

The interest rate is 4 per cent on the unpaid balance of the loan. Repayment may be up to 33 years.

The proposed housing must be adequate to meet the family's needs yet modest in size and design.

To be eligible an applicant must own a farm or a housing site in a rural area; be without decent, safe and sanitary housing, and be unable to obtain the needed credit from other sources. He must also have sufficient income to meet payments on existing debts, meet other expenses, and make payments on the proposed loan.

The local area committee of the Farmers Home Administration determines the eligibility of applicants.

Other loans available include Operating, Farm Ownership, and Sell and Water.

Pavement For Big Eddy Substation

Bonneville Power Administration today awarded a \$8,430 contract to Interstate Paving Company of The Dalles for pavement of the direct-current test area at Big Eddy Substation, three miles east of The Dalles.

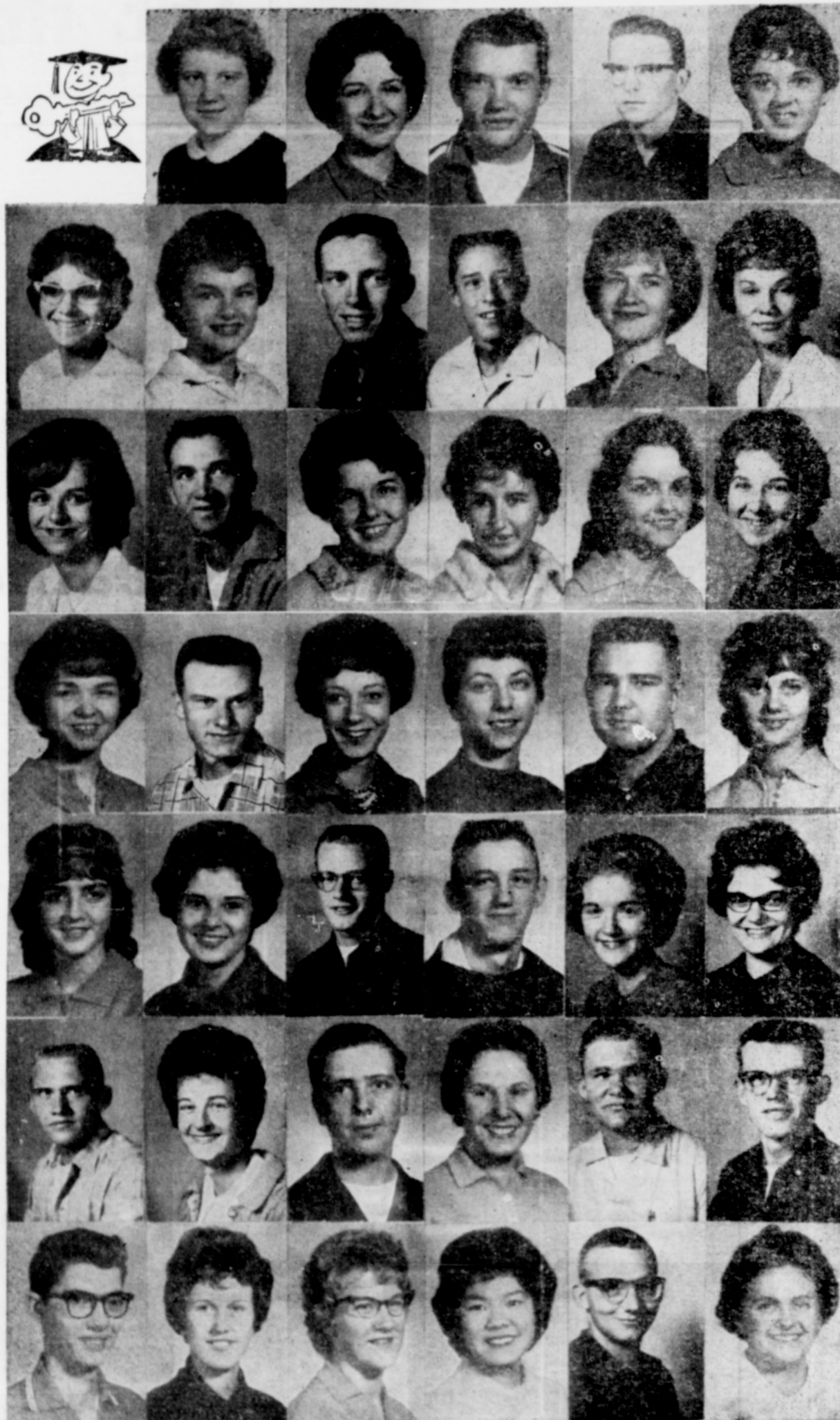
The contractor will have 10 calendar days after notice to proceed to place a crushed rock base and finish with asphaltic concrete paving over the base.

The \$2,000,000 Big Eddy direct-current test facility is being constructed to work out design and technical standards for a proposed interregional high-voltage (1,100,000 volt) alternating current transmission line when testing is completed.
