## Taxpayers Second Installment Due

Taxpayers paying estimated income tax are, according to A. G. Erickson, Director of Internal Revenue for Oregon, required to pay their second installment of tax due on 1963 estimated income by June 15.

If the income expected to be earned during 1963 has changed, taxpayers should file an amended declaration of Estimated Tax. A blank form for use as an amend-

ed return is printed on the back of the bill which taxpayers receive for an installment of Estimated Tax. Mr. Erickson pointed out.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that sealed bids will be received at the office of the Sherman County Clerk at the Courthouse in Moro, Oregon, up until 5 p.m. July 2, 1963 for the following:

For furnishing approximately 45,000 gallons, more or less of diesel oil, and approximately 30,000 gallons, more or less of regular gasoline for Sherman County; and approximately 2000 barrels, more or less of fuel oil, approximately 16,000 gallons of diesel or dielscline more or less, and approximately 30,000 gallons of gasoline, more or less, for Sherman County School Districts No. 3, Rufus; No. 7, Wasco; No. 9C1, Kent; No. 17 Moro; No. 23, Grass Valley, and for the Sherman County High School District No. 1 and the Sherman County Rural School District for the 1963-64 fiscal year as specified.

Specification and bid sheets may be obtained at the office of the County Clerk at the Courthouse in Moro, Oregon.

For gasoline, bidder shall bid at price per gallon less federal tax, delivered in the storage tanks of the county at the courthouse, county shed and rock crusher; and in the storage tanks of the various school districts.

Successful bidder will bill each district and the county separately. Effective period shall be between July 1, 1963 and June 30, 1964.

The gasoline, diesel oil, and fuel oil bids shall be considered one bid.

The bidder shall use the bid form furnished with the Fuel Oil, diesel oil, and gasoline requirement sheets.

It is further understood that the amounts listed in the specifications are estimates only, and the county and each district may purchase more or less according to their individual needs.

Bids will be opened and read aloud at 3:00 p.m., Wednesday, July 3, 1963 in the County Court Room in the Courthouse at Moro, Oregon.

The Court reserves the right to reject any or all bids.
