

Series E and H Savings Bonds Sales Excellent

Sales of Series E and H savings bonds in Oregon in May were exceptionally good, according to figures received here today by County Savings Bonds Committee Chairman. During last month, Oregonians purchased \$2,773,925 worth of United States Savings Bonds, an excellent record for the first month of the Freedom Drive which concludes on July Fourth.

"While last month's sales were up only 1.2 percent compared to May of 1962", "we have to remember that last year's May sales were exceptional" high for the month. For example, our sales this year were \$226,000 greater than in May, 1961 and \$360,000 greater than they were in 1960".

"By the end of May, six Oregon cities had passed their Freedom Bond sales quotas, some of them by substantial amounts. These cities in the order that they reached their Freedom Bond Drive quotas were as follows: Condon, Hermiston, Prineville, Cottage Grove, Burns, and Lakeview. Since all of these quotas were higher than actual sales in these cities for May and June combined last year, the achieving of the sales goals this early represents a real accomplishment".

The County Chairman expressed strong hopes that by July Fourth every family in the County having a regular income would "help his country while helping himself" by buying at least one extra Savings Bond.

OREGON STATE GRANGERS SCHEDULE MEETING JUNE 10-14 AT OREGON CITY

Several thousand Oregon State Grange members are expected to gather in Oregon City June 10 to 14 for the 90th annual session of the state's only farm family fraternal organization. This year's meeting, the first to be held in Oregon City in 53 years, and the first in Clackamas County since 1942, is considered particularly important. This is because the National Grange will hold its 97th annual session in Portland's Multnomah hotel November 11 to 20, inclusive.

More than 100 resolutions have already been adopted by Subordinate (local) or Pomona (county-wide) Granges and have been submitted for consideration by the State Grange. This work will be handled by one or more of two dozen sessions committees which have been appointed by Allen P. Wheeler, Portland, Master of the Oregon State Grange.

An innovation this year will be a community church service, sponsored by the State Grange, to be held at 8 p.m. June 9 in the Oregon City senior high school gymnasium, where most of the week-long convention will be held. Wheeler expressed the hope that churches of the Oregon City area will join with the Grange when it holds its non-denominational evening service. Faith in a Supreme Being and good moral character are two of the basic beliefs of the Patrons of Husbandry, as the Grange is known formally.

The state session will open officially at 9 a.m. June 10. Lee Faust, Oregon City mayor, is scheduled to welcome Grangers at 10 a.m. Committee chairmen will then be introduced to the 800 or more official delegates, and deliberation on the resolutions will start.

The largest number of resolutions has been assigned to the Good of the Order committee which has 13; Legislative and Pure Foods committee has eight; the Education and the By-Laws committees have seven each.

Any Grange member in good standing can attend any of the committee meetings in which he is interested, and can take part in the discussion of any resolution, but he cannot vote on them unless he is a delegate. The same thing holds true concerning the general sessions - all Grangers are welcome at the meetings, and they may address the group on any topic which is under consideration at the time, but voting on the various questions is restricted to official delegates, who are the Masters of the Granges and their spouses or their duly elected alternates. Either a man or woman can be the official head of a Grange, and his or her spouse shares voting privileges at the state and national meetings.

Special events scheduled for the senior high school gymnasium the evening of June 10 are judging of youth drill teams at 7 and the State Lecturer's program at 8:30.

State Master Wheeler will deliver the first annual address at 9:30 a.m. June 11, and J. D. McDonald, Portland, president of

the AFL-CIO, will address the Grangers at 2:30 p.m. These speeches and the Monday evening program will be open to the Public. Selection of a meeting place for 1964 is scheduled for 4 p.m.

More than 600 people are expected to take the sixth, or state, degree at 8:30 p.m. June 12 in preparation for the seventh degree, which is the highest in the Order, to be conferred during the national session in November. Governor Mark O. Hatfield is

to address the State Grange at a meeting open to the public at 10 a.m. June 13.

The 90th annual session is expected to finish its work late in the evening of June 14.
