How Can You Best Avoid Suffering Heart Attack?

Possibilities of preventing heart attacks are "very encouraging" if individuals will heed the advice they're getting from medical and health leaders, speakers at the Institute on Cardiovascular Health stressed this week at OSU.

Some people are so careless about their weight, diet and health habits—including smoking—that they build up odds of one chance in two or worse that they'll have a coronary attack in middle age, Dr. Jeremiah Stamler of Chicago noted.

He is director of the heart disease control program for the Chicago Board of Health. A dozen other national leaders spoke during the three-day institute.

"Watch your weight" is a key in heading off a heart attack and being healthy and happy, Stamler said. It has been "repeatedly documented" that obesity and coronary problems go hand in hand, he emphasized.

Industry - Supported Program To Halt Menace Of Litter

A new industry - supported program to halt the growing menace of litter in the Northwest was announced today.

The program, called CLEAN (Committee for Litter Elimination Around the Northwest), is directed by Eugene B. Kasper, Auburn, who successfully created the regional beautification and "Operation Smile" programs that preceded the Seattle World's Fair.

"The litter situation is critical, especially at this time when our states are seeking greater tourist trade and when the health and safety problems caused by litter are increasing," Kasper said.

"There is no doubt that our citizens are becoming more and more disturbed by the public regard for our scenery, our streets, and our recreation areas," he declared.

"The carelessness with which vacationers and residents discard rubbish is appalling. We intend to do something about it by providing a vigorous program, coordinating the many volunteers and organizations working on this problem in the Northwest. We have the beginnings of strong backing by industry, which will add a new dimension to the fight against litter."

Some of the wide range of industrial supporters are firms that produce products that often become litter, some are involved in the tourist and travel market, but these and many others see the anti-litter crusade as a critical public service.

"CLEAN is 'enthusiastically endorsed' by Keep America Beautiful and by the National Clean-up Paint-up. Fix-up Bureau and will work closely with these and other groups," Kasper said.

Fifty-four percent of all the deaths in the United States this year will come from cardiovascular problems, it was noted.

"Middle-age spread" is nothing to joke about, Dr. Stamler told the 200 persons in attendance. Overweight people have 3 or 4 times greater chance of high blood pressure problems than those who keep their weight in line.

Diet is a factor in cardiovascular health simply because Americans eat so well and so much, the speakers pointed out.

Stamler stressed "moderation" in the diet. Select foods high in nutrients and low in calories, he said. Stay away from overly rich foods, eat lean meats in moderate size servings, consider low-fat dairy foods and more fish and seafoods, and be wary of saturated fats and high-cholesterol foods, he recommended.

Heavy smoking greatly increases chances of heart attack too, he continued. A study made in Farmington, Mass. and Albany, N.Y. showed a coronary death rate for smokers six times that of non-smokers for men between the ages of 40 and 49.
