The immigration restriction bill just finished by congress is N.G.

C.L. Ireland is back from the ramp session of the Assembly in Hog'en.

THE OBSERVER is under obligations to Secretary of State Kincaid for a handsomely bound copy of his biennial report. It is a valuable document and we prize it highly.

Sherman county does not appear in the list of counties delinquent to the state for taxes but since the biennial disburse has failed to do its duty Sherman county will send up no state funds to be juggled with during the next two years.

Referring to Kincaid's library volume the Pendleton Tribune says: "The report as a whole is highly complimentary of the secretary, and in fact contains the only panegyric of him that we have seen in print during his incumbency."

A cotemporary remarking about the Salem disgrace says: "It seems hard that the fruits of a national victory must be snatched from the party to gratify the spleen of the Oregonian, the savior of Joe Simon, and the ambition of Jonathan Bourne."

The name of Hon. Binger Hermann is prominent in connection with the commissionership of the general land office. He is thoroughly familiar with public land matters and would be satisfactory to the people of the west. It is positively stated that he has been offered the place.

It is certainly Providential that little Greece, daring to defy the sultan defending the people of her religious faith, has acquired the Island of Crete, showing to the balance of the world that it was a very easy task to teach the Turk a lesson upon other than mercenary principles.

Hon. E. B. Dufur is a democrat, and THE OBSERVER had no hand in sending him to Salem, but we may say, candidly, he did not like Esau, sell his birthright for a mess of pottage, nor lend his name to Joe Simon strewing to the winds every promise made for the relief of a long suffering and poverty-stricken people.

J. W. Bernstater, who has lived in the Cascade mountains for many years, making a home for himself and family, was fined for cutting timber on his ranch. While there is little doubt but that President McKinley will pardon him he must "move off," as a technicality in his homestead entry gives him no rights under the forestry scheme.

In Jones county, Iowa, the cow has proved of far more benefit as a revenue raiser than 10-cent corn and a creamery has become established as one of the institutions of the community. In that county alone the farmers have in bank deposits over \$3,000,000, according to the latest report of the state commissioner. Here is an object lesson to the farmers of Sherman county.

Bolton, county treasurer, from remitting the state taxes until after an assembly can be elected by the people who will go to Salem and act like sensible men.

MORO ELECTRIC PLANT.

Messrs. Moore Bros., Moro bankers and all round enterprising business gentlemen, still keeping in view the effort to supply Moro with electric power, fuel and lights, through the medium of power running to waste in the DesChutes, have secured data from New York which promises soon to materialize the hope long deferred. The cost of the plant at the factory, 24,000 lbs., will be \$7,250 free on board; freight \$400; wire at cost, laid down either at Portland or San Francisco. This arrangement contemplates the delivery of 100 horse power to one motor 7 miles from the generating station. Poles set 50 to the mile and fitted with cross arms to carry three wires would be added to above cost. It is expected the company will soon send one of its agents to Moro to go over the ground with Messrs. Moore, and finally settle all details for the plant.

Missouri has demonstrated that a man's millions will not prevent him from paying the penalty of death for murder, by the hanging of young Duestrow who murdered his wife and child in St. Louis two years ago.

The first black walnut lumber manufactured on the Pacific coast from Pacific coast timber was sawed a few days ago at the Horton mill in Benton county. The logs came from trees planted while the commonwealth was still in swaddling clothes.

Some people claim there was no election of United States senator by the assembly at Salem. The "qualified" members could have elected Mr. Mitchell many times over, and he would then have taken his seat following an investigation at Washington.

Themasses in Salem still cling to the rump as we go to press this week. Under the constitution it requires a joint resolution of both houses to adjourn the legislature. As there is no house recognized by the senate, the question arises, "how will it adjourn?"

By far the best cartoon of the legislative fiasco is that in the "exclusively Salem boy" newspaper, entitled A Yard of Pop-pies. It shows Bourne, Craig, U'ren and others as full-blown poppies, Davis and Vogle as buds, and Riddle and Povey gone to seed. The picture should be seen to be appreciated.

Alabama is shipping iron to Glasgow. In spite of the high price maintained by the trust, last year the United States exported 72,500 tons of steel rails valued at \$1,712,000 or \$23.60 a ton. Some of these rails went to Canada and some to South America. The rupture of the steel rail pool marks the crisis of an economic revolution whose effect will be felt sooner or later all over the world. Up to this time it has been a question whether the people of the United States could make their own iron without the artificial aid of a protective tariff. Now it begins to be a question whether we shall not make the iron of the world.

If enough farmers will agree to test sugar beet culture in Sherman county the necessary seed can be obtained for 20 to put in a quarter acre each. If the test is favorable there are those that stand ready to put in a factory of sufficient capacity to use all the beets produced in the county another year. It is doubtful if Western Oregon conditions of summer heat, soil, etc., are at all adapted to successful cultivation of the plant and if, as we believe, Sherman county is adapted to the cultivation of sugar beets, it is a matter worthy of careful attention at all events, and the sooner it is tried the better it will be for all concerned.

Chesnes as Family Registers.

In the cheese regions of Switzerland a custom prevails for the friends of a bride and bridegroom to join in the presentation to them on their wedding day of an elaborate cheese.
