She was born in Springfield, Ill., in 1829 and was a schoolmate of Abraham Lincoln. She was married in Springfield and started across the plains to make a home in the west. On the way she was stricken with the prevailing fever, and the party with which she was traveling stopped in the Grand Ronde valley, expecting her to die. But with the wonderful vitality with which she was endowed, she recovered and lived to rear a large family of useful citizens. The family first settled in Linn county, but in 1859 removed to their present large farm on the Tumalum, where they have since resided."

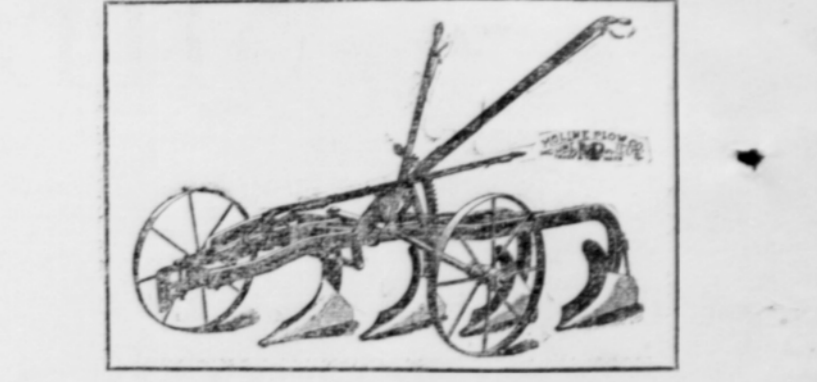
