### The New M. E. Church of Moro.

Its Beginning and Its Completion. Dedication Services.

About one year ago the Columbia River Annual Conference divided the Moro and Spaulding Chapel circuit. By this division Moro became a new and separate charge. Rev. C. D. Nickelson was appointed pastor of this new work. Immediately upon entering the work, the enterprise of a new church was begun. A subscription of \$1654 was secured as a basis. The work was soon begun and on April 30th was completed and dedicated.



### THE DEDICATORY SERVICE

Was grand and inspiring. Through the efforts of Dr. Lloyd D. Idleman and Mr. Ladr Barnum as ushers, the church accommodated about 500 persons. Promptly at 11 o'clock the pastor announced the program—beginning by singing an appropriate hymn from the hymnal. Following, the Presiding Elder, Rev. R. Warner, led in an eloquent prayer. Rev. Charles Elery, of Wasco, then read a Scripture Lesson, followed by a beautiful Anthem, rendered by the choir. Rev. F. L. Jones, of Spaulding Chapel, then read the 2d Scripture Lesson, which was followed by an eloquent sermon by Chancellor Thoburn, of Portland. The pulpit effort has never been excelled in Moro. The Dr. was at his best, and the large audience was deeply influenced by his soul inspiring message. The sermon was intensely spiritual and patriotic. After the sermon a call was made for \$900.00 the amount necessary to relieve the church of all embarrassment. The congregation responded with a subscription of \$1048. The trustees and building committee then came forward and the church was formally dedicated.

The church was beautifully decorated for the occasion with the stars and stripes, and a profusion of flowers and evergreens. After the services several hundred people enjoyed the dinner at the Opera hall prepared by the Ladies Aid Society and friends. This new edifice is one of the most beautiful structures in Eastern Oregon. It is a credit to this city; the denomination; the contractor, W. A. Raymond; the painter R.M. Brash. The total cost of the edifice is about \$2700.
